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world religions canadian perspectives eastern traditions provides students with a solid introduction to the study of world religions and highlights how canadians have both experienced and shaped these religions this text covers areas traditionally considered to be foundational while also including material to address contemporary concerns by addressing both the historical and the current impacts of religion students come to learn how in our increasingly globalized world religions intersect and influence each other

now in its third edition this is the most comprehensive work available on the rich variety of paths available to today s spiritual seekers more than an academic reference it explores how religions can collaborate to help the world essays exploring the realm of building an interfaith community add to the book s detailed portraits of the major religious traditions the sourcebook also contains essays on spiritual practices as diverse as theosophy wicca and indigenous religions this revised edition of the sourcebook offers an unparalleled look at where spirituality is headed in the coming millennium

with nine out of ten canadians claiming a religious affiliation of some kind catholic protestant jewish islamic hindu buddhist aboriginal or one of dozens of other religions faith has huge impact on our personal and social lives in this book robert choquette offers a comprehensive history of religion in canada and examines the ongoing tug of war between modernity and conservatism within the religious traditions themselves published in english

the religions of canadians draws on the expert knowledge and personal insights of scholars in history the social sciences and the phenomenology of religion to introduce the beliefs and practices of nine religious traditions

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this collection of essays explores how women from a variety of religious and cultural communities have contributed to the richly textured pluralistic society of Canada focusing on women's religiosity it examines the ways in which they have carried and conserved and brought forward and transformed their cultures old and new in modern Canada each essay explores the ways in which the religiosities of women serve as locations for both the assertion and the refashioning of individual and communal identity in transcultural contexts three shared assumptions guide these essays religion plays a dynamic role in the shaping and reshaping of social cultures women are active participants in their transmission and their transformation and a focus on women's activities within their religious traditions often informal and unofficial provides new perspectives on the intersection of religion gender and transnationalism since the first European migrations Canada has been shaped by immigrant communities as they negotiated the tension between preserving their religious and cultural traditions and embracing the new opportunities in their adopted homeland viewing those interactions through the lens of women's religiosity the essays in this collection model an innovative approach and provide new perspectives for students and researchers of Canadian studies religious studies and women's studies

the Buddhist World joins a series of books on the world's great religions and cultures offering a lively and up to date survey of Buddhist studies for students and scholars alike it explores regional varieties of Buddhism and core topics including Buddha nature ritual and pilgrimage in addition to historical and geo political views of Buddhism the volume features thematic chapters on philosophical concepts such as ethics as well as social constructs and categories such as community and family the book also addresses lived Buddhism in its many forms examining the ways in which modernity is reshaping traditional structures ancient doctrines and cosmological beliefs

secularization gender and identity broadening the context it studies the interrelation between religion and other fields including education business economics and law the book presents a vast array of examples to illustrate the changes that have taken place and have led to a new world map of religions beginning with an introduction of the concept of the changing world religion map the book first focuses on nature ethics and the environment it examines humankind's eternal search for the sacred and discusses the emergence of green religion as a theme that cuts across many faiths next the book turns to the theme of the pilgrimage illustrated by many examples from all parts of the world in its discussion of the interrelation between religion and education it looks at the role of missionary movements it explains the relationship between religion business economics and law by means of a discussion of legal and moral frameworks and the financial and business issues of religious organizations the next part of the book explores the many new faces that are part of the religious landscape and culture of the global north europe russia australia and new zealand the u s and canada and the global south latin america africa and asia it does so by looking at specific population movements diasporas and the impact of globalization the volume next turns to secularization as both a phenomenon occurring in the global religious north and as an emerging and distinguishing feature in the metropolitan cosmopolitan and gateway cities and regions in the global south the final part of the book explores the changing world of religion in regards to gender and identity issues the political religious nexus and the new worlds associated with the virtual technologies and visual media

others from all the world's religious traditions this set is an unprecedented examination of religion's influence on modern life an honest assessment of how religion can either destroy us or preserve us and a thorough exploration of what steps might be necessary for all religions to join together as a force for good because of the attack on the world trade center on september 11 2001 the very concept of religion underwent a paradigm shift instead of standing for virtue and piety peace and harmony the word religion also came to be inextricably associated with evil aggression and terror people around the world began to question whether the religious and secular dimensions of modern life can be reconciled whether the different religions of the world can ever coexist in harmony indeed the very future of religion itself has sometimes seemed to be uncertain or at least suspect

a growing chorus of voices has suggested that the world's religions may become critical actors as the climate crisis unfolds particularly in light of international paralysis on the issue in recent years many faiths have begun to address climate change and its consequences for human societies especially the world's poor this is the first volume to use social science to examine how religions are helping to address one of the most significant and far reaching challenges of our time while there is a growing literature in theology and ethics about climate change and religion little research has been previously published about the ways in which religious institutions groups and individuals are responding to the problem of climate change seventeen research driven chapters are written by sociologists anthropologists geographers and other social scientists this book explores what effects religions are having what barriers they are running into or creating and what this means for the global struggle to address climate change

what is religious studies and what is its future in atlantic canada how have universities founded by roman catholic and protestant denominations and public universities differed as they approached the study of religious life and traditions religious studies in atlantic canada surveys the history and place of the study of religion within canadian universities following a historical introduction to the public and denominationally founded universities in the atlantic region the book situates the departments of religious studies in relation to the distinctive characteristics of the various universities in the region focusing on curriculum research and teaching bowlby

examines the current strengths of the religious studies departments in atlantic canada and where those departments are fragile i e where departments have thrived because of careful long term planning as well as where crises of retirements have radically affected the size and strength of departments in conclusion bowlby suggests strategies for future survival and growth in the field of religious studies religious studies in atlantic canada is the last of a six part series on the state of the art of religious studies in canada a unique account of the regional differences in the development of religious studies in canada written for anyone interested in the teaching of religion as well as the specialist the book provides an introduction and an overview of religious studies curricula faculty research and teaching areas at the region s universities

around the world and how we know it examines religious freedom and diversity including agnostics and atheists on a global scale highlighting trends over the past 100 years and projecting estimates for the year 2050 outlines the issues and challenges related to definitions taxonomies sources analyses and other techniques in interpreting data on religious adherence considers data from religious communities censuses surveys and scholarly research along with several in depth case studies on the global muslim population religion in china and the religious demography of recently created sudan and south sudan argues against the belief that the twentieth century was a secular period by putting forward new evidence to the contrary provides resources for measuring both qualitatively and quantitatively important data on the world s religious situation in the twenty first century

after the terrorist attacks of 9 11 those in london and madrid and the arrest of the toronto 18 canadians have changed how they think about terrorism and security as governments respond to the potential threat of homegrown radicalism many observers have become concerned about the impact of those security measures on the minority groups whose lives are securitized in religious radicalization and securitization in canada and beyond paul bramadat and lorne dawson bring together contributors from a wide range of academic disciplines to examine the challenges created by both religious radicalism and the state s and society s response to it this collection takes a critical look at what is known about religious radicalization how minorities are affected by radicalization from within and securitization from without and how the public media and government are attempting to cope with the dangers of both radicalization and securitization religious radicalization and securitization in canada and beyond is an ideal guide to the ongoing debates on how best to respond to radicalization without sacrificing the commitments to multiculturalism and social justice that many canadians hold dear

this book brings attention to the understudied and often overlooked question of how curricula and classroom practices might inadvertently reproduce exclusionary discourses and narratives that omit or negate particular cultures histories and wisdom traditions with a focus on representations and classroom practices related especially to ancient and indigenous wisdom traditions and cultures it includes unique contributions from scholars studying these questions in

various contexts the book offers a range of important studies from various contexts across the americas including canada the various member nations of the caribbean community caricom puerto rico and the united states the various chapter contributions address and discuss nuances of each of the contexts under study the contributions also help highlight some key commonalities across these contexts including how dominant discourses and various forces have historically shaped and continue to shape and reproduce such omissions misrepresentations and marginalization in addition to seeking to reconcile with some of these ancient and indigenous wisdom traditions and cultures the book charts a path forward toward more holistic analytical frameworks as well as more inclusive and balanced representations and classroom practices in these aforementioned geographic contexts and beyond it will appeal to scholars researchers undergraduate and graduate students with interests in indigenous education curriculum studies citizenship education history of education religion and educational policy

analyzing the dramatic growth of buddhism in canada in global and historical contexts

problems of integration failed political participation and requests for various kinds of accommodation seem to dominate the research on minority muslims in western nations beyond accommodation offers a different perspective showing how muslim canadians successfully navigate and negotiate their religiosity in the more mundane moments of their lives drawing on interviews with muslims in montreal and st john s selby barras and beaman examine moments in which religiosity is worked out they critique the model of reasonable accommodation which has been lauded internationally for acknowledging and accommodating religious and cultural differences the authors suggest that it disempowers religious minorities by implicitly privileging christianity and by placing the onus on minorities to make requests for accommodation the interviewees show that informal negotiation occurs all the time scholars however have not been paying attention this book advances a new model for studying the navigation and negotiation of religion in the public sphere and presents an alternative picture of how religious difference is woven into the fabric of canadian society
