the field of popular music studies is growing but still lacks some basic reference materials the chronology of american popular music 1899 2000 fills this gap by offering a comprehensive overview of the field it will be a must own for libraries and individuals interested in this growing field of research

resonances is a compelling collection of new essays by scholars writers and musicians all seeking to explore and enlighten this field of study noise seems to stand for a lack of aesthetic grace to alienate or distract rather than enrapture and yet the drones of psychedelia the racket of garage rock and punk the thudding of rave the feedback of shoegaze and post rock the bombast of thrash and metal the clatter of jungle and the stuttering of electronica together with notable examples of avant garde noise art have all found a place in the history of contemporary musics and are recognised as representing key evolutionary moments noise therefore is the untold story of contemporary popular music and in a critical exploration of noise lies the possibility of a new narrative one that is wide ranging connects the popular to the underground and avant garde fully posits the studio as a musical instrument and demands new critical and theoretical paradigms of those seeking to write about music

we live in a pop age gone loco for retro and crazy for commemoration band re formations and reunion tours expanded reissues of classic albums and outtake crammed box sets remakes and sequels tribute albums and mash ups but what happens when we run out of past are we heading toward a sort of cultural ecological catastrophe where the archival stream of pop history has been exhausted simon reynolds one of the finest music writers of his generation argues that we have indeed reached a tipping point and that although earlier eras had their own obsessions with antiquity the renaissance with its admiration for roman and greek classicism the gothic movement s invocations of medievalism never has there been a society so obsessed with the cultural artifacts of its own immediate past retromania is the first book to examine the retro industry and ask the question is this retromania a death knell for any originality and distinctiveness of our own

for understanding the most influential and electrifying bands of this era coverage is further supplemented with entries on a wide assortment of musical trends and side topics associated with punk rock and new wave music

arguably no other author has inspired more musicians than has howard phillips lovecraft here for the first time is a book documenting the music inspired by the works of this literary genius with insights provided by the artists the book features a foreword by h p lovecraft expert s t joshi and cover artwork by joseph vargo

first published in 2005 the encyclopedia of recorded sound 2nd edition is an a to z reference work covering the entire history of recorded sound from edison discs to cds and mp3 entries range from technical terms acoustics back tracking quadrasonic to recording genres blues opera spoken word to histories of industry leaders and record labels to famed recording artists focusing on their impact on recorded sound entries range in length from 25 word definitions of terms to 5000 word essays drawing on a panel of experts the general editor has pulled together a wealth of information the volume concludes with a complete reference bibliography and a deep index

this book focuses on the relationships between underground urban music cultures in los angeles and specific urban imaginaries related to music practices far away and sometimes in stark opposition to the commodified image of the city crafted by urban planners and associated urban stakeholders rather than this commodified city and the imaginary city of the mind it examines the accidental tangential life of a mirage the city that appears in the distance is one that is formed by songs and music making the book shows how counter urban imaginaries emerge and are performed through diverse underground music making practices giving rise to alternative ways of seeing the city

this book explores alan moore s career as a cartoonist as shaped by his transdisciplinary practice as a poet illustrator musician and playwright as well as his involvement in the northampton arts lab and the hippie counterculture in which it took place it traces moore s trajectory out from the underground comix scene of the 1970s and into a commercial music press rocked by the arrival of punk in doing so it uncovers how performance has shaped moore s approach to comics and their political potential drawing on the work of bertolt brecht

who similarly fused political dissent with experimental popular art this book considers what looking strangely at alan moore as cartoonist tells us about comics their visual and material form and the performance and politics of their reading and making

psychedelics have long been sanctioned as dangerous substances today psychedelics are enjoying a new found appeal even being idealized as wonder drugs as part of the so called psychedelic renaissance reports abound about the benefits of these substances for remedying individual mental health issues and bringing about social change offering a critical view of these developments psychedelic capitalism locates this renaissance in the context of corporate capture medicalization and the war on drugs wealthy entrepreneurs are investing billions in the psychedelics industry biotechnology firms are racing to capture intellectual property and monopolize psychedelic supply chains venture capitalists are leveraging the prospects of a lucrative mass market together these actors are appropriating indigenous knowledge and claiming ownership over substances that have been in the public domain for centuries brownlee and walby ask if corporations and the medical establishment are suited to steward the mainstreaming of psychedelics raising concerns with how the psychedelic renaissance is entrenching systems of inequality limiting access and affordability and increasing the reach of drug war surveillance and criminalization interrogating the consequences of psychedelic capitalism the authors point to what could be gained from a just and equitable psychedelic future rooted in the public interest

this comprehensive portrait of tropicália exploring everything from influences and results to context and main players demonstrates how the genre helped reinvent brazil s cultural identity in a post colonial world while bossa nova nurtured a snobbish audience rooted in jazz and música popular brasileira mpb spoke to a multicultural yet oppressed nation tropicália invested in a crossover instigated by the progressive youth who refused to glorify a past it didn t identify with and whose outdated codes it didn t intend to perpetuate this portrait of tropicália exploring everything from influences and results to context and main players shows how the genre helped reinvent brazil s cultural identity in a postcolonial world the genre s core comes from a unique mix of native and foreign influences tropicália doesn t reject the international pop panorama but is an undeniable product of it the book sets the strangling military dictatorship and its resulting censorship serving as the sociopolitical backdrop of the genre tropicália propelled culture and counterculture forward moving away from senseless niche intellectualisms in favour of a broader reach of brazilian music

history is littered with evidence of humanity s fascination with drugs and the pursuit of altered states from early romanticism to late nineteenth century occultism and from fin de siècle paris to contemporary psychedelic shamanism psychoactive substances have played catalyzing people yet serious analysis of the religious dimensions of modern drug use is still lacking the use of drugs and the pursuit

of transcendence from the nineteenth century to the present day beginning with the romantic fascination with opium it chronicles the discovery of anesthetics the psychiatric and religious interest in hashish the bewitching power of mescaline and hallucinogenic fungi the more recent uses of lsd as well as the debates surrounding drugs and religious experience this fascinating and wide ranging sociological and cultural history fills a major gap in the study of religion in the modern world and our understanding of the importance of countercultural thought offering new and timely insights into the controversial relationship between drugs and mystical experience
