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in the mid 20th century o hobart mowrer was a celebrated academic psychologist owing largely to his experiments with animals and humans that

led to breakthrough theories on how we learn his numerous publications in this arena propelled him to the post of president of the american psychological association in 1954 his own battles with depression led him to develop a new theory of psychotherapy which he called integrity therapy the premise of this modality is that the client s deception with people they care about is the source of conscience pangs but the client resists or represses the prompting of the conscience and this causes his or her psychological symptoms treatment therefore consists of urging the client to acknowledge his or her hidden behaviors to themselves and to significant others that they might both gain restored community with intimates and the fruits of personal integrity and inner peace to come clean about their deceptions and rewarding the confession with approval this book explores the conceptual underpinnings of integrity therapy and mowrer s unique treatment approach detailing his methods for setting conditions for therapy assessing clinical data rules of engagement for transference and countertransference and handling client resistance case examples and transcripts are included to demonstrate key points of this technique mental health professionals interested in mowrer s ideas or the history of psychotherapy will find this book to be a valuable and interesting resource

a client raises spiritual questions can a christian therapist working in a government agency talk with a client about faith a young couple with two children asks a christian counselor to help them negotiate an end to their marriage what responsibility does the counselor have to try to repair the relationship a youth group member confidentially reveals to the pastor that he is taking drugs should the pastor tell the boy s parents a counselor who teaches a college course has a client show up for class what should she do these are just a few of the complex dilemmas that therapists counselors and pastors face nearly every day handling these situations appropriately is critical for both the client s progress and the professional s personal credibility and protection from liability state and federal codes professional association statements and denominational guidelines have been drawn up to address ethical issues like competence confidentiality multiple relationships public statements third parties and documentation in this book you ll find them all compiled and interpreted in light of christian faith and practice written by qualified professional counselors and respected academic instructors this book is an indispensable resource for understanding and applying ethics in christian counseling today

first published in 1986 when the first edition of this book was published in 1964 it was seen as being in the area of irregulars in the psychotherapy field as behavior therapies had not yet found a place in the established genre the new edition catches up on twenty years of academic and scientific study which have done much to resolve conflict and validate the major modes of psychotherapy spinoffs of familiar therapies have moved the field toward synthesis integration and ecumenism on one hand cognitive behavior therapies and toward antinomian religions and recreation on the other

betrayal in all its forms has been and is an ever present reality in every area of life politics business and human relationships to name a few recent publications have chronicled the unethical actions of mental health and other human service professionals yet the psychology of betrayal has received little public interest and attention this book explores the many issues relating to psychotherapy and betrayal the contributing authors of betrayal in psychotherapy and its antidotes present the various faces of betrayal as may be encountered by therapists in the office or in the profession they challenge therapists to understand the violations of trust that can occur within the therapeutic relationship readers are reminded that the trauma of betrayal manifests itself within all patients regardless of the nature and expression of psychopathology more importantly the

authors define betrayal as experienced with specific cases and they attempt to bring out underlying principles that are useful to therapists and the larger professional community readers will find their understanding of the concept of betrayal much expanded from the chapters in betrayal in psychotherapy and its antidotes for example betrayal is discussed as a failure in the interpersonal or inter subjective relationship between therapist and client in one chapter as opposed to the concept of betrayal as an act calculated to lead another person astray an act of deception or treachery and a breach of confidence and trust as considered in another chapter other approaches to betrayal and psychotherapy include how to determine what is betrayal in psychotherapy the use of case examples to establish the importance of the therapist striving to remain true to the genuine potentiality of a patient how to avoid colluding with the patient s rejection of life the work of alice miller a psychoanalyst by training and the betrayal of children by abuse the paradoxical nature of psychiatric practice and its necessary reliance upon moral reasoning an investigation on the link between therapists personal maturity and the success of therapy how traditional humanistic and analytic therapies can entrap both therapist and patient into a betrayal of self and the relationship implications of the betrayal of the feminine in males and their work with clients in a psychotherapy setting a case portrayal of teddy the betrayal of the betrayed

this is a good valuable addition to the literature on ethics in the therapeutic practice sexual and relationship therapy most books about ethics focus either on the origins of ethics or on the application of ethical thinking to a single form of therapy this book sets out to span a range of very different forms of therapy and explores the similarities and the differences between the ethical thinking of the practitioners concerned by looking at ethical issues in different therapeutic settings the reader is challenged to reconsider the working assumptions which underpin familiar therapeutic practice readers of forms of ethical thinking in therapeutic practice are offered the unique opportunity to gain insights into the ethical thinking of experienced practitioners offering strikingly different services to their clients and working in contrasting contexts essential reading for all practitioners in counselling and the therapies students trainers supervisors and providers of therapeutic services

first published in 1988 all counselling approaches are means to helping people stand on their own two feet and assume effective responsibility for their lives thus personal responsibility becomes an obvious integrating focus though the concept gets implicitly or explicitly emphasized in all existing theoretical positions none has provided the deserved coverage focusing on personal responsibility is almost like focusing on one s nose though right in front of the face the concept is not always easy to observe this book aims at integration in a number of ways it rejects the narrow my theory right or wrong approach to counselling theoretical concepts and practical interventions are derived from a number of different sources including the research literature the book does not take a one dimensional approach to behaviour in emphasizing people s actions alone instead it

takes a three dimensional approach emphasizing feelings thoughts and actions

the techniques of psychotherapy are often given undue emphasis slighting the importance of the psychotherapist research suggests that the same techniques are differently effective when used by equally trained and supervised therapists not only are some therapists more effective irrespective of the type of therapy they practice but some because of their personal qualities may actually harm those with whom they work this research reflects the vast importance of the personality of the therapist evoking the question of how a therapist may develop personhood aimed at training as well as practicing psychotherapists social workers counselors psychologists and psychiatrists this scholarly exploration of personhood includes various models for classifying the types of psychotherapy and the place of personhood in this context as well as a review of existing theory and research literature on specific personal therapist variables as they relate to therapy outcome the role of traditional spirituality in the development of personhood is given particular emphasis

this book drawing on the author s 26 years as a music therapist explores experience and evidence in music therapy it asks which experiences count why and what is revealed of the cultures of music therapy when some experience is regarded as evidence and some is not at the heart of music

therapy lies a nonverbal phenomenon shared musical encounter those involved can recognise it and respond without words as insiders however what this experience is and how it relates to evidence is not widely explored in music therapy practice and research furthermore the investigations which do exist tend to be verbal even when participants are nonverbal as an alternative this autoethnographic book honours the arts based encounters fundamental to music therapy by offering the reader their own arts based experience through poems images and more through them the reader or collaborator is invited to consider the other knowing which comes from arts based encounter and its value using phenomenological and aesthetic critical realist approaches this work argues that relational musical experience central to music therapy is valuable on its own terms as musically mediated therapeutic evidence of personhood this challenges the professional status quo which privileges verbal knowledge creation and evidence measured by outsiders
