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written through both the first and second person singular passionate being takes its author and its reader on a journey that has them thinking of their experience of and belonging to language and the possibility of an instance of the world taking place without prejudice and exclusion at its beginning it brings to its author the question what can you say the responses that ensue turn our attention toward presupposition and about how singularity can be said the book also brings into play among others the work of giorgio agamben it asks us to view both language and the world taking place without presupposition revealing both the political implications and those for living that this vision holds it is a work to be read twice with pleasure and then again

challenging the notion of feminism as a unified discourse this book assembles writings that address art film architecture popular culture new media and other visual fields from a feminist perspective the book combines classic texts with six newly commissioned pieces articles are grouped into thematic sections each introduced by the editor providing a framework within which to understand the shifts in feminist thinking in visual studies as well as an overview of major

feminist theories of the visual this reader also explores how issues of race class nationality and sexuality enter into debates about feminism in the field of the visual book cover

this book presents new ways of approaching photographic discourse from a queer perspective offering discussions on what a queering methodology for photography may entail by drawing links between artistic strategies in photographic practice and key theoretical concepts from photography theory queer theory critical theory and philosophy with different examples of conceptual perspectives including representation formalism and mediumlessness it seeks to diversify queer methodology for photography while primarily addressing photography this book is entwined with broader philosophical questions concerning identity difference and the creations of systems of thought that limit the possibilities of existence to binary categorisation it proposes a new concept of the photographic image that addresses its materiality in the form of the poetic and the political in relationship to a generative principle that is named as a queer quality the photograph s ability to voice queer concerns also beyond its role as representation this book will be of interest to scholars working in photography art history queer studies new materialism and posthumanism

a vibrant critical exchange between contemporary art and christianity is being increasingly prompted by an expanding programme of art installations and commissions for ecclesiastical spaces rather than religious art reflecting christian ideology current practices frequently initiate projects that question the values and traditions of the host space or present objects and events that challenge its visual conventions in the light of these developments this book asks what conditions are favourable to enhancing and expanding the possibilities of church based art and how can these conditions be addressed what viable language or strategies can be formulated to understand and analyse art s role within the church focusing on concepts drawn from anthropology comparative religion art theory theology and philosophy this book formulates a lexicon of terms built around the notion of encounter in order to review the effective uses and experience of contemporary art in churches the author concludes with the prognosis that art for the church has reached a critical and decisive phase in its history testing the assumption that contemporary art should be a taken for granted element of modern church life art and the church a fractious embrace uniquely combines conceptual analysis critical case studies and practical application in a rigorous and inventive manner dealing specifically with contemporary art of the past twenty five years and the most recent developments in the church s policies for the arts

brought together for the first time these writings by visual artist and writer yve lomax are united by a common thread they place writing itself the written image into the repertoire of visual art the book both proposes and demonstrates this development it also has a twofold purpose and function it can be read and enjoyed as performance often resembling poetry thick with ideas images and metaphors it is also an original contribution to theoretical writing on the visual particularly relating to the image and difference celebrating and referring to the work of michel serres gilles deleuze luce irigaray and others in pursuit of its own strategy of introducing the written image into the theoretical text

it has recently become apparent that criticism has fallen on hard times either commodification is deemed to have killed it off or it has become institutionally routine this book explores contemporary approaches which have sought to renew criticism's energies in the wake of a theatrical turn in recent visual arts practice and the emergence of a performative arts writing over the past decade or so issues addressed include the performing of art's histories the consequences for criticism of embracing boredom distraction and other queer forms of inattention and the importance of exploring writerly process in responding to aesthetic experience bringing together newly commissioned work from the fields of art history performance studies and visual culture with the writings of contemporary artists after criticism provides a set of experimental essays which demonstrate how the critical might live on as a vital and efficacious force within contemporary culture

this ground breaking work has been fully updated in detailing the painting sculpture and photography of gay or lesbian artists set in the context of current issues cooper makes a vital contribution to debates on art gender and sexuality

creative writing and art history considers the ways in which the writing of art history intersects with creative writing essays range from the analysis of historical examples of art historical writing that have a creative element to examinations of contemporary modes of creative writing about art considers the ways in which the writing of art history intersects with creative writing covers a diverse subject matter from late neolithic stone circles to the writing of a sentence by flaubert the collection both contains essays that survey the topic as well as more specialist articles brings together specialist contributors from both sides of the atlantic
