in the late nineteenth century jewish scholars began to be interested in jesus and eventually paul as important figures in the history of the jewish people rightly understood they argued jesus and paul belonged more to judaism than to christianity as even radical critical christian scholars were concluding the earliest believers in jesus were exclusively jews forming something like a new sect within judaism the emergence of the christianity of the new testament soon became a focus of attention for jewish scholars and with this a host of questions arose such as about the influence of hellenism the parting of the ways the widespread christian misperception of judaism the tragedy of anti semitism and the identity of jesus as messiah and lord the present essays address these and other issues maintaining throughout the tension of continuity and discontinuity and stressing the underappreciated radical newness of the new testament

most books about paul the apostle are long and very detailed and for many a potential reader a daunting prospect a short book about paul is deliberately brief but its brevity is not at the cost of accuracy we trace the main contours of paul s life which turn on the hinge of the singular event outside damascus in c ad 34 from that time the leading persecutor of the disciples became the dedicated preacher of the message about jesus this short book shares with many the opinion that paul remains the most influential voice from greco roman antiquity apart that is from the lord whose servant he was at the same time many critics have found fault with him especially from the time of the enlightenment paul s achievements were considerable between ad 47 56 he established a network of congregations in five roman provinces syria cilicia galatia macedonia achaia and asia his thirteen surviving letters are witnesses to his dedicated pastoral care of these tiny far flung gatherings not to be missed was his remarkable skill in recruiting a small army of loyal coworkers like timothy luke and titus the result of paul s decade long journeys in the provinces of anatolia and greece was the planting of the seeds of christianity that would develop into the official religion of the eastern roman empire based in constantinople

considering the importance of pneumatological themes for interpreting paul s argument of galatians grant buchanan explores how paul draws from jewish traditions of creation and the spirit and presents a fresh cosmogony to the galatian church he suggests that galatians outlines an epistemological shift in how paul sees past present and future reality in light of christ and the presence of the spirit in the lives of the believers the most crucial aspect of this new cosmogony is the centrality of the spirit in paul s argument in galatians 3 1 6 17 with buchanan s exegesis revealing that the spirit the galatians identity as children of god and the new creation motif are not merely elements of paul s argument but intrinsic to it buchanan demonstrates that paul renders jewish and gentile identities no longer valid instead revealing that god s favour and election is already with them by stating that those who have the promised spirit are all children of god he examines jewish biblical and second temple extra biblical texts that explicitly connect the spirit to creation themes including genesis ezekiel the dead sea scrolls and the wisdom of solomon taking galatians 6 11 17 as the body closing of the letter the new creation

motif directly implies the activity of the spirit in the creation of christian identity analysing 6 15 from this pneumatological perspective buchanan argues that the new creation motif represents a key aspect of paul s generative cosmogony and pneumatology indicating a far broader socio cosmic transformation than previously assumed and it becomes a key to understanding paul s argument

this study argues for the recovery of trust as a central theme in christian theology and offers the first theology of trust in the new testament displaying trust between god christ and humanity as a risky dynamic forward looking life changing partnership

in this careful and provocative study chad thornhill considers how second temple understandings of election influenced key pauline texts with sensitivity to social historical and literary factors while paul is able to move beyond ancient categories of a collective view of election thornhill shows how he also follows these patterns
