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improving the use of evidence in teacher preparation is one of the greatest challenges and opportunities for our field the chapters in this volume explore how data availability quality and use within and across preparation programs shed light on the structures policies and practices associated with high quality teacher preparation chapter authors take on critical questions about the connection between what takes place during teacher preparation and subsequent outcomes for teachers and students which has remained a black box for too long despite a long history of teacher preparation in the u s and a considerable investment in preservice and in service training much is still to be learned about how pre service preparation impacts teacher effectiveness a strong empirical basis that informs how specific aspects of and approaches to teacher preparation relate to outcomes for graduates and their prek 12 student outcomes will provide a foundation for improved teaching and learning our book responds to stakeholders collective responsibility to students and teachers to act more deliberately issues of data availability and quality the uses of data for improvement priorities for future research and opportunities to promote evidence use in teacher preparation are discussed throughout the volume to inspire collective action to push the field towards more use of evidence chapters present research that uses a variety of research designs methodologies and data sources to explore important questions about the relationship between teacher preparation inputs and outcomes

this important book takes the discussion of racial inequality in america beyond simplistic arguments of white racism and black victimization to a more complex conversation about the separate but unequal situation in many schools today amy stuart wells and robert crain investigate the st louis missouri school desegregation plan a unique agreement that since 1983 has given black inner city students the right to choose to attend predominantly white suburban schools after five years of research and hundreds of interviews with policymakers administrators teachers students and parents wells and crain conclude that when school desegregation is examined from these many perspectives more strengths than weaknesses emerge they call for a reexamination of now popular school choice policies across the country so that these policies may help to bring about more racial and social class integration stepping over the color line intertwines data on student achievement and racial isolation with stories of the people who participated in the st louis program the authors set

these individuals within a broad historical and social context and demonstrate how important linkages between the past and present help explain why efforts to overcome racial inequality in st louis and in the larger society are so difficult the authors do a superb job of explaining how this innovative program came about placing it in a broad context that takes it beyond its immediate and local implications the book is at times heartbreaking and at times uplifting richard zweigenhaft co author of blacks in the white establishment a study of race and class in america
