exotic appetites is a far reaching exploration of what lisa heldke calls food adventuring the passion fashion and pursuit of experimentation with ethnic foods the aim of heldke s critique is to expose and explore the colonialist attitudes embedded in our everyday relationship and approach to foreign foods exotic appetites brings to the table the critical literatures in postcolonialism critical race theory and feminism in a provocative and lively discussion of eating and ethnic cuisine chapters look closely at the meanings and implications involved in the quest for unusual restaurants and exotic dishes related restaurant reviews and dining guides and ethnic cookbooks

black internationalist feminism examines how african american women writers affiliated themselves with the post world war ii black communist left and developed a distinct strand of feminism this vital yet largely overlooked feminist tradition built upon and critically retheorized the postwar left s nationalist internationalism which connected the liberation of blacks in the united states to the liberation of third world nations and the worldwide proletariat black internationalist feminism critiques racist heteronormative and masculinist articulations of nationalism while maintaining the importance of national liberation movements for achieving black women s social political and economic rights cheryl higashida shows how claudia jones lorraine hansberry alice childress rosa guy audre lorde and maya angelou worked within and against established literary forms to demonstrate that nationalist internationalism was linked to struggles against heterosexism and patriarchy exploring a diverse range of plays novels essays poetry and reportage higashida illustrates how literature is a crucial lens for studying black internationalist feminism because these authors were at the forefront of bringing the perspectives and problems of black women to light against their

marginalization and silencing in examining writing by black left women from 1945 1995 black internationalist feminism contributes to recent efforts to rehistoricize the old left civil rights black power and second wave black women s movements

in this broadly conceived exploration of how people represent identity in the americas suzanne bost argues that mixture has

been central to the definition of race in the united states mexico and the caribbean since the nineteenth century her study is particularly relevant in an era that promotes mixed race musicians actors sports heroes and supermodels as icons of a new america bost challenges the popular media s notion that a new millennium has ushered in a radical transformation of american ethnicity in fact this paradigm of the changing face of america extends throughout american history working from literary and historical accounts of mulattas mestizas and creoles bost analyzes a tradition dating from the nineteenth century of theorizing identity in terms of racial and sexual mixture by examining racial politics in mexico and the united states racially mixed female characters in anglo american african american and latina narratives and ideas of mixture in the caribbean she ultimately reveals how the fascination with mixture often corresponds to racial segregation sciences of purity and white supremacy the racism at the foundation of many nineteenth century writings encourages bost to examine more closely the subtexts of contemporary writings on the browning of america original and ambitious in scope mulattas and mestizas measures contemporary representations of mixed race identity in the united states against the history of mixed race identity in the americas it warns us to be cautious of the current millennial celebration of mixture in popular culture and identity studies which may contrary to all appearances mask persistent racism and nostalgia for purity

south asian writers in twentieth century britain is the first book to provide a historical account of the publication and reception of south asian anglophone writing from the 1930s to the present based on original archival research drawn from a range of publishing houses this comparison of succeeding generations of writers who emigrated to or were born in britain examines how the experience of migrancy the attitudes towards migrant writers in the literary market place and the critical reception of them changed significantly throughout the twentieth century ranasinha shows how the aesthetic cultural and political context changed

significantly for each generation producing radically different kinds of writing and transforming the role of the postcolonial writer of south asian origin the extensive use of original materials from publishers archives shows how shifting political academic and commercial agendas in britain and north america influenced the selection content presentation and consumption of many of these texts the differences between writers of different generations can thus in part be understood in terms of the different demands of their publishers and expectations of readers in each decade writers from different generations are paired accordingly in each chapter nirad chaudhuri 1897 1999 with tambimuttu 1915 83 ambalavener sivanandan born 1923 with kamala markandaya born 1924 salman rushdie born 1947 with farrukh dhondy born 1944 and hanif kureishi born 1954 with meera syal born 1963 raja rao mulk raj anand attia hosain v s naipaul and aubrey menen are also discussed

this book explores the problematic of reading and writing about third world women and their texts in an increasingly global context of production and reception the ten essays contained in this volume examine the reception both academic and popular of women writers from india bangladesh palestine egypt algeria ghana brazil bolivia guatemala iraq israel and australia the essays focus on what happens to these writers poetry fiction biography autobiography and even to the authors themselves as they move between the third and first worlds the essays raise general questions about the politics of reception and about the transnational character of cultural production and consumption this edition also provides analyses of the reception of specific texts and of their authors in their context of origin as well as the diverse locations in which they are read the essay participate in on going discussions about the politics of location about postcolonialism and its discontents and about the projects of feminism and multiculturalism in a global age

scholars of asian history and politics feminists human rights activists documentary filmmakers visual artists and novelists have begun to address the subject of the comfort system to take up the cause of the surviving comfort women s sturggles to call attention to sexual violence against women especially during wartime to consider the links among militarism racism imperialism and sexism and to include this history into 20th century political history this volume contains a cross section of responses to the issues raised by the former comfort women and their new visibility on the international stage its focus is on how theorists historians researchers activists and artists have been preserving interpreting and disseminating the legacies of the comfort women and also drawing lessons from these the essays consider the impact and influence of the comfort women s stories on a wide variety of fields and describe how those stories are now being heard or read and used in asian and in the west

this innovative contribution to understanding the promise and contradictions of contemporary postcolonial culture applies a wide array of theoretical tools to a large body of literature the author compares the work of established indian writers including bharati mukherjee meena alexander sara suleri and sunetra gupta to new writings by such afro italian immigrant women as ermina dell oro maria abbeb viarengo ribka sibhatu and sirad hassan sandra ponzanesi s analysis highlights a set of dissymmetrical relationships that are set in the context of different imperial linguistic and market policies by dealing with issues of representation linked to postcolonial literary genres to gender and ethnicity questions and to new cartographies of diaspora this book imbues the postcolonial debate with a new plan
