behind the glitter of hollywood lies a high powered multibillion dollar business whose workings are known only to industry insiders in the movie business book forty of hollywood s most celebrated producers directors screenwriters agents lawyers marketers distributors exhibitors and deal makers reveal the secrets of their trade in personal accounts that are both highly informative and wonderfully entertaining this new edition fully revised and updated for the movie industry of the 90s includes such unique perspectives as david puttnam on producers sydney pollack on directors henry jaglom on independent filmmaking mike medavoy on studio management richard childs on home video martin polon on new technology and thirty four more

catholicism was all over movie screens in 2004 mel gibson s the passion of the christ was at the center of a media firestorm for months a priest was a crucial character in the academy award winning million dollar baby everyone it seemed was talking about how religious stories should be represented marketed and received catholic characters spaces and rituals have been stock features in popular films since the silent era an intensely visual religion with a well defined ritual and authority system catholicism lends itself to the drama and pageantry of film moviegoers watch as catholic visionaries interact with the supernatural priests counsel their flocks reformers fight for social justice and bishops wield authoritarian power rather than being marginal to american popular culture catholic people places and rituals are all central to the world of the movie catholics in the movies begins with an introductory essay that orients readers to the ways that films appear in culture and describes the broad trends that can be seen in the movies hundred year history of representing catholics each chapter is written by a noted scholar of american

religion who concentrates on one movie engaging important historical artistic and religious issues each then places the film within american cultural and social history discusses the film as an expression of catholic concerns of the period and relates the film to others of its genre tracing the story of american catholic history through popular films catholics in the movies should be a valuable resource for anyone interested in american catholicism and religion and film

nayola the digital art book of the movie shares with the reader a nine year journey through the creative process of developing and producing this animated feature movie the digital book is organized into twelve chapters that initially refer the reader to the process of adapting the script based on two literary works written by two renowned african writers first a short story written by josé eduardo agualusa an angolan writer then a play written by josé eduardo agualusa and mia couto a mozambican writer by accessing the links in the digital book the reader can read the short story then the play and finally the script understand and enjoy the way in which two plots emerged in the script one based on the play and the other on an original journey exterior and interior of the main character throughout the movie few books on cinematographic creative processes give the reader so many possibilities being a movie set in angola a country in southern africa taking place in the final phase of the rather unknown angolan civil war and in the first years of peace that followed the book shares with the reader information about these two consecutive wars that lasted 40 years ancestral angola its colonial period and the present the way in which the history culture peoples languages and ecosystems of this beautiful country were incorporated into the movie in a visual and sound narrative poetic and dazzling afterwards the digital book reveals to the reader how a fiction with strong roots in angolan reality was created it describes the importance of the repérages carried out the long development phase associated with detailed investigations into all aspects of the movie from african masks to geomorphology flora and fauna to the customs and rituals of the indigenous peoples of the desert from popular music to the hip hop movement the matriarchal structure of angolan society to the intervention of women in the civil war professional and amateur angolan actors poets and musicians recorded the voices of all characters in luanda the reader can see interviews with the three voice actors that created the voices of the three protagonists of the movie through links available in the digital book six excellent angolan musicians composed and performed the songs that make up the movie soundtrack the script incorporates memories poems and songs by the angolan voice actors the reader will be able to see and hear them through links available in the digital book the digital book is profusely illustrated and many hyperlinks allow the reader to consult from the first graphic studies of the characters and backgrounds to their final version colour tests animation tests the storyboard and the animatic the reasons that led to the choice of the animation techniques used in the movie are shared with the reader the plot in the past in 2d and in archival footage the plot in the present in 3d oneiric sequences in animated painting finally the producer and co producers tell the reader about the work processes of this international co production that involved five countries portugal belgium france the netherlands and angola and more than 100 collaborators we believe that the digital book will be very interesting for film students and professionals especially animation cinema animation movie fans and spectators in general these stories people and places that inspired us we hope they inspire you too virgílio almeida screenwriter josé miguel ribeiro movie director review nayola a journey through the creative process at radix in spanish radixanimacion com criticas resena nayola artbook

surfing has fascinated filmmakers since thomas edison shot footage of waikiki beachboys in 1906 before the 1950s surf craze surfing showed up in travelogues or as exotic background for studio features the arrival of gidget 1959 on the big screen swept the sport into popular culture but surfer filmmakers were already featuring the day s best surfers in self narrated two reelers hollywood and independent filmmakers have produced about three dozen surf films in the last half century including the frothy beach party movies point break 1991 and chasing mavericks 2012 from bud browne s earliest efforts to the endless summer 1966 riding giants 2004 and today s brilliant videos over 1 000 surfing movies have celebrated the stoke this first full length study
