motility relating to the vital energy of the human tissues is a basic concept in osteopathy this book presents a simple and systematic definition of motility based on the movement of all of the body s structures during embryogenesis those initial movements intrinsic to the energy of the tissues are the essence of motility and as such they are crucial to the tissues normal movement these fundamental ideas expand the osteopath s clinical intervention techniques and deepen the understanding of both the bases of

osteopathy and of human functions illustrated in two colours with clear and original line drawings and photographs this book offers the new model of practice developed by alain auberville over his 30 years of experimentation and teaching it is presented here by andree aubin who has linked alain auberville s approach to classic osteopathic concepts in order to facilitate its integration into regular clinical practice

this text is divided into sections in order to present an osteopathic approach to dysfunction manifesting in a particular system pertinent to a common clinical presentation the divisions are grouped by their common autonomic and lymphatic elements the purpose of the book is to explore selected structural and functional consideration which may produce symptoms or compromise homeostasis it also demonstrates by example clinical application of the osteopathic philosophy in selected situation lastly it attempts to show where osteopathic manipulative treatments can be prescribed as primary or adjunctive modalities available to the do as they assist patients in reaching their maximum health potential

biophysical neurobiological and psychological interactions as well as the interplay of developmental dynamics and further epigenetic influences on the organism as well as the primary respiratory mechanism various biological rhythms play an important role within osteopathic treatment the book explores new insights that flow from chronobiology and rhythm research all osteopathic practice develops on conceptual foundations acknowledging the importance in the practice of osteopathy of such theoretical underpinning the book discusses osteopathy with regard to the development of paradigms within the healing arts as well as from various philosophical viewpoints such as postmodern system theoretical goethian and phenomenological it examines thoroughly the multi layered dynamics of development of human beings interacting with their environment the resulting implications for therapeutic interaction as well as principles of diagnosis and treatment form the core of the book these fundamental principles are then specifically applied to the cranial sphere this section focuses primarily on the treatment of the brain as well as the developmental dynamics of the relations of the midline cranial bones dural structures vessels and cranial nerves

far from being simply a sequence of techniques as practised in many countries osteopathy is an independent primary health care system based on principles applied through a manual practice a unique profession that takes care of the whole person through the application of five models biomechanical neurological respiratory circulatory metabolic and behavioral these conceptual models of the relationship between structure and function allow osteopaths to evaluate treatment with the aim of promoting health rather than curing disease this book is intended as a manual for both students and osteopathic professionals interested in exploring the principles objectives origins and application of the five osteopathic models from traditional concepts up to a modern vision based on evidence and critical thinking the selection criteria and rules for the application of each model with their limitations and potential are examined to enable the reader to understand the rationale behind their use in a comprehensive holistic and patient centered practice

this book is a textbook of basic osteopathic concepts working from first principles underpinned by anatomy and physiology this text will synthesize and integrate osteopathic models in an easy to understand way a subject often daunting to students and confusing to graduates composed of four sections the first is a discussion of basic principles the second focusses on models and diagnosis of treatment which is followed by anatomical neurophysiological and osteopathic considerations the last section describes

clinical case studies to enable students to put into practice the theories and models which they have learned this book is essential reading for all osteopathic bsc degree courses and a core textbook for undergraduate students at the end of each section there will be clinical examples for students to work on to integrate previous knowledge key point boxes

this user friendly book will guide the reader to understand how balanced ligamentous tension blt can be used as a therapeutic principle in the practice of osteopathy the application of blt is powerful precise and specific but is also safe and comfortable for the patient and has been embraced with interest by osteopaths worldwide blt is seen by many as an indispensable bridge between the better known structural and cranial approaches and is an essential but almost forgotten part of the osteopathic heritage in using the gentle exaggeration of the lesion this approach is rooted in the original teaching of at still osteopathy s founder and that of his student w g sutherland who realised how potently the point of balanced tension can activate the innate self correcting forces in the articular system this teaching was passed on directly to the author by william sutherland s close friend and student anne wales d o as well as giving technical guidance and acting as a reference citing relevant contemporary physiological research this book is steeped in osteopathic philosophy it seeks to enhance understanding of the reciprocal relationship between structural integrity and healthy function by illustrating how the contact we make on the outside of the body influences the spatial environment of the physiology within this highly effective approach can enable the practitioner to engage with the patient s potential for improved wellbeing and health
