meteorological and cinematic affinity casts film weather as a means of artfully and mechanically conquering contingency through contingency of taming weather through a medium itself ephemeral and enduring using film theory history formalist phenomenological analysis and eco criticism this book casts cinema as weather insofar as our skies and screens become readable through our interpretation of changing phenomena

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
