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concerns over iran s nuclear programme north korea s nuclear brinkmanship and in the past iraq s apparent pursuit of wmd have captured the world s attention and dominated the agenda of the american foreign policy establishment but what led policymakers and the us military to emphasise the threat of rogue states at the end of the cold war going behind the vivid language of the axis of evil and portrayals of undeterrable and reckless rogue states this work demonstrates how the rogue state doctrine satisfied both domestic and international goals in the clinton and george w bush administrations underpinning efforts to maintain us leadership and hegemony it offers a clear picture of the policymaking process taking a broad historical approach that places the actions of us officials towards iraq iran north korea libya and cuba in a wider context through an understanding of the long standing influences on the us approach we are better able to appreciate why for instance regime change dominated the post 9 11 agenda and led to the overthrow of saddam hussein explaining in detail how the tackling of rogue states became a central aim of us foreign policy miles examines whether there was continuity between the clinton and bush approach he moves on to highlight the influence of congress on the implementation of us policies and the difficulties the us faced in selling its approach to allies and adapting its hard line strategies to reflect developments within the targeted states by considering the impulses and drivers behind the development of the rogue states approach this work will extend the scope of existing work in the field and will be of interest to scholars and policymakers alike

despite the increase in the number of studies in international relations using concepts from a role theory perspective scholarship continues to assume that a state s own expectations of what role it should play on the world stage is shared among domestic political actors cristian cantir and juliet kaarbo have gathered a leading team of internationally distinguished international relations scholars to draw on decades of research in foreign policy analysis to explore points of internal contestation of national role conceptions nracs and the effects and outcomes of contestation between domestic political actors nine detailed comparative case studies have been selected for the purpose of theoretical exploration with an eye to illustrating the relevance of role contestation in a diversity of settings including variation in period geographic area unit of

analysis and aspects of the domestic political process this edited book includes a number of pioneering insights into how the domestic political process can have a crucial effect on how a country behaves at the global level

based on a meta theoretical approach and insights derived from analytic eclecticism as a comparative instrument olumuyiwa babatunde amao assesses nigeria and south africa s foreign policy and intervention behavior in africa with a special focus on the conflict episodes in sierra leone 1991 1998 and the democratic republic of congo drc 1997 2005 the foreign policy and intervention behavior of africa s middle powers an analytic eclecticism approach explores the relative merits of structural realism and social constructivism in explaining nigeria and south africa s motives and intervention behavior and why more than one theoretical perspective is required to sufficiently analyze the complexity of their intervention decisions and behavior it demonstrates the overlapping nexus between conflict intervention structural constraints relative power pursuit and the dynamics of regional complexes amao demonstrates how nigeria and south africa s relative power positions identities as african actors de colonization and anti apartheid struggles and the existing values and bonds that their contiguous states share play a crucial role in their intervention behavior using sierra leone and the drc as case studies this book illustrates the advantage of applying a multi perspective eclectic approach to foreign policy analysis and provides an alternative to the theoretical turf wars that are all too prevalent in the discipline of international relations

the us led coalition which launched an invasion of iraq on 20 march 2003 led to a decade long military presence in the country in the run up to that invasion many comparisons were made with the 1991 gulf war ahmed ijaz malik takes these two instances of military intervention by republican us governments to highlight how the official discourse of leaders and decision makers has an impact on foreign policy and its results by taking these two examples he examines how discourse affects real events and the extent to which the legacy of the cold war has influenced the decisions which are made at the upper echelons of the us government us foreign policy and the gulf wars critically analyses the post cold war liberal cosmopolitan and realist discourses related to these two instances of us military intervention using an approach which malik labels critical realism this book examines the ways in which discourses often act as ideological covers for material interests whilst still not holding a deterministic view whereby these interests alone shape policies from this perspective this book assesses the themes of just war humanitarianism and cosmopolitanism it furthermore uses the approach of critical realism to engage with a variety of arguments on the emerging role of the us as they were displayed in academic discourses and other intellectual contributions around each of the

1991 and 2003 wars malik relates these discussions to an analysis of the official discourses documents and policies displayed prior to the 1991 and 2003 wars as well as to an examination of the resulting actual conduct since the implications of the us military presence in the middle east are so central to the study of international relations and security studies this book will be invaluable for specialists in these disciplines as well as for those interested in policy formation and the wider middle east

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john quincy adams warned americans not to search abroad for monsters to destroy yet such figures have frequently habituated the discourses of u s foreign policy this collection of essays focuses on counter identities in american consciousness to explain how foreign policies and the discourse surrounding them develop whether it is the seemingly ubiquitous evil of hitler during world war ii or the more complicated perceptions of communism throughout the cold war these essays illuminate the cultural contexts that constructed rival identities the authors challenge our understanding of others looking at early applications of the concept in the eighteenth century to recent

twenty first century conflicts establishing how this phenomenon is central to decision making through centuries of conflict

the central aim of this book is to foster connections between scholarly discussions of german foreign policy and broader theoretical debates in international relations and beyond while there has been a lively discussion about new german foreign policy this book argues that it has not engaged substantially with international and foreign policy theory especially with respect to its more recent developments reviewing the recent literature on german foreign policy this book posits that the most discussed works are still largely provided by the altmeister maull szabo bulmer and paterson who were already dominating the field a quarter of a century ago while there is a general decline in the academic study of german foreign policy the chapters in this edited volume show that a range of novel theoretically sophisticated but often disconnected scholarship has appeared on the margins this book contributes to this emerging work by providing conceptual interrogations which question the existing research and provide theoretically grounded alternatives initiating critical discussions and evaluations of the nature of germany s actorness and the environment in which it operates and proposing applications of less familiar perspectives on german foreign policy the chapters in this book were originally published as a special issue of german politics

this analysis of henry kissinger s historical philosophy statecraft and views on international politics reveals kissinger to be a transitional figure who urged a conversion of american foreign policy from an insular to a continental approach

in an era of increasing interdependence among nations the foreign policies of poor countries are becoming a subject of critical interest to scholars and the public alike neil r richardson adopts a political economy perspective to examine the foreign policy repercussions of international economic dependence are dependent countries compliant in their foreign policies acquiescing to the preferences of the industrial giants on which they rely for foreign trade investment and aid revenues or are they instead prepared to defy their dominant economic partners these are the major concerns of richardson s rigorous investigation the book begins with a characterization of economic dependence and its possible impact on the foreign policy decisions of dependent governments ideas from both interdependence and dependencia scholarship are extracted in order to explain the reliance of poor countries on their rich partners these economics are linked to the foreign policies of poorer countries by considering how the mechanisms of dependence may create pressures on foreign policymakers several combinations of pressures are plausible and each set yields a differing expectation about their foreign policies the second part of the book is an empirical test of these foreign policy predictions for the

years 1950 1973 richardson analyzes the foreign policy behavior as reflected in certain votes in the united nations general assembly of a number of poor countries that are economically dependent on the united states to varying degrees the results suggest several surprising conclusions contrary to one common assumption these mostly latin american and caribbean countries are not necessarily locked into a condition of perpetual dependence richardson finds that the foreign policies of the economic dependencies are not easily manipulated by the united states not only do annual changes in their external economic reliance fail to correspond to their u n voting behavior but the dependencies as a group are no longer clear voting allies of the united states after the late 1960s these and other results bear theoretical and policy implications that conclude the book foreign policy and economic dependence will be of interest to specialists in quantitative international relations and american foreign policy

can a distinct national foreign policy still be identified for small eu member states and what accounts for the balance between national and eu foreign policy henrik larsen develops an analytical framework for analyzing these questions and offers solutions through an empirical examination of the foreign policy of a small eu member state in the context of eu foreign policy the case of denmark the book looks at seven policy areas policy towards other eu member states anti terrorism development the balkans africa latin america and trade on the basis of the empirical study the implications for the theoretical study of national foreign policy in an eu context are outlined it is suggested that we need a new mixed approach to foreign policy analysis within the eu taking into account the nature of the policy area concerned and national conceptions of actorness
