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this 1893 survey ranks among the most important books about the impact of frontier life on u s society it examines the frontier s role in promoting self reliance independence democracy immigration and westward expansion

this three volume encyclopedia on the history of american food and beverages serves as an ideal companion resource for social studies and american history courses covering topics ranging from early american indian foods to mandatory nutrition information at fast food restaurants the expression you are what you eat certainly applies to americans not just in terms of our physical health but also in the myriad ways that our taste preferences eating habits and food culture are intrinsically tied to our society and history this standout reference work comprises two volumes containing more than 600 alphabetically arranged historical entries on american foods and beverages as well as dozens of historical recipes for traditional american foods and a third volume of more than 120 primary source documents never before has there been a reference work that coalesces this diverse range of information into a single set the entries in this set provide information that will transform any american history research project into an engaging learning experience examples include explanations of how tuna fish became a staple food product for americans how the canning industry emerged from the civil war the difference between americans and people of other countries in terms of what percentage of their income is spent on food and beverages and how taxation on beverages like tea rum and whisky set off important political rebellions in u s history

it seems to be a tenet of the human condition to perceive others as different and potentially hostile in nearly all societies stereotypes are developed to stigmatize suspected enemies within and without the american case is particularly interesting in this respect because american society consists of nothing but others to be open to others and welcome those who are different is one of the basic tenets of the country however this principle often conflicts with the need to integrate all these strangers into a homogeneous governable society which causes the formation of hostile stereotypes of certain ethnic groups that do not fit in the authors in this volume look at the development of these enemy images which form a fairly consistent pattern from the period of the american revolution to the post world war ii era in doing so they focus on the question of to what extent these enemy images influence the formulation and outcome of foreign domestic and immigration policies

before this book first appeared in 1963 most historians wrote as if the continental expansion of the united states were inevitable what is most impressive henry steele commager and richard morris declared in 1956 is the ease the simplicity and seeming inevitability of the whole process the notion of inevitability however is perhaps only a secular variation on the theme of the expansionist editor john l o sullivan who in 1845 coined one of the most famous phrases in american history when he wrote of our manifest destiny to overspread the continent allotted by providence for the free development of our yearly multiplying millions frederick merk rejected inevitability in favor of a more contingent interpretation of american expansionism in the 1840s as his student henry may later recalled merk loved to get the facts straight from the foreword by john mack faragher
