borax is a black book of toadmanship which includes the rituals for procuring the toad's boon historical accounts alchemical relevance folk traditions surrounding horsemanship wortcunning witchcraft the devil and necromancy it contains the mystery section of the book which reflects upon both classical interpretations but as well as the author's own insights through mystic vision and praxis with the spirit that attends the batrachian boon the jewel of midnight serves the reader as they serve it
