literary histories of course do not have a reason for being unless there exists the literature itself this volume perhaps more than others of its kind is an expression of appreciation for the talented and dedicated literary artists who ignored the odds avoided temptations to write for popularity or prestige and chose to write honestly about the american west believing that experiences long knowns to be of historical importance are also experiences that need and deserve a literature of importance

these twelve interrelated stories set in a fertile california valley portray the human failings and frailties and the illusions and pretensions that undermine the rich promises of the pastures of heaven

katerina koci charts the development of the promised land motif starting from its biblical roots and examining its reception over the centuries until the present day as her cornerstone koci uses hans georg gadamer s claim that there are two complementary paths towards understanding and

knowledge science and art thus to be faithful to the creed of the great hermeneutist koci ventures into both topics arguing that while science sets out historical critical analysis of the promised land motif in the hebrew bible and its later receptions art enriches the interpretation with its literary illustrations this volume places particular focus on american contexts since the concept of the promised land is so deeply intertwined with american religious political mythologies and with the art of john steinbeck and walter brueggemann in particular by discussing artistic interpretation in biblical hermeneutics the context and reception of genesis 15 7 and exodus 3 8 in the hebrew bible and new testament and the history of the promised land motif and its interpretations koci argues that artistic receptions of biblical motifs are crucial for biblical scholarship in opening new hermeneutical and thematical horizons

john steinbeck was born in 1902 in california s salinas river valley although he worked briefly as a reporter in new york it was in the salinas valley that he spent the depression years and his experiences and the people he met became the basis for his books of mice and men opened the eyes of the public to the desperate lives of the migrant workers the grapes of wrath told the story of the destitute oklahoma dust bowl farmers who flocked to the valley in search of work cannery row painted the rough and tumble lives of the cannery workers in nearby monterey and east of eden his most personal novel revolved around the lives of two families from the valley whose story was a tragic metaphor for the suffering humans needlessly cause one another steinbeck was the recipient of both the nobel and pulitzer prizes for literature and was named to the american academy of arts and letters and the national institute of arts and letters his books were likewise embraced by the public many reached the top of the bestseller lists four of them were made into broadway shows and six were made into movies despite these successes he often doubted his abilities the critics were seldom kind to him making his doubts grow but at the end of his life he realized that by championing the causes of the underprivileged he had made a lasting impression on the social consciousness of america he died in new york in 1968 keith ferrell gives us a fascinating account of john steinbeck a writer who continually struggled to awaken america s social conscience steinbeck s ability to incorporate the dark side of life in rich stories of human strength has captured the souls of millions of readers everywhere

cannery row east of eden of mice and men the red pony and other classic stories by nobel prize winning writer john steinbeck are set in the agricultural and ocean front commnuities of the salinas valley and monterey peninisula with 126 color photos and 2 maps this attractive souvenir and guide brings steinbeck country to life for visitors as well as readers unable to visit california

increasing specialization within the discipline of english and american studies has shifted the focus of scholarly discussion toward theoretical reflection and cultural contexts these

developments have benefitted the discipline in more ways than one but they have also resulted in a certain neglect of close reading as a result students and researchers interested in such material are forced to turn to scholarship from the 1960s and 1970s much of which relies on dated methodological and ideological presuppositions the handbook aims to fill this gap by providing new readings of texts that figure prominently in the literature classroom and in scholarly debate from james s the ambassadors to mccarthy s the road these readings do not revert naively to a time before theory instead they distil the insights of literary and cultural theory into concise introductions to the historical background the themes the formal strategies and the reception of influential literary texts and they do so in a jargon free language accessible to readers on all levels of qualification

wider ideological pattern and in distinguishing between its different and sometimes opposing historical effects

representing the author's interest spanning over thirty five years the essays expose white's evocation of dimensions other than material reality his preoccupation with epiphanies and mythmaking and his constant forging of a poetic style

to appreciate and understand John Steinbeck's stories students must comprehend what it was like to live during the Great Depression and they must understand the working man to whom Steinbeck was attempting to appeal through direct quotations biographical details and in depth discussions of his style themes and form this text will allow readers to ponder and interpret Steinbeck's works
