susceptible to sudden and dramatic shocks and stresses a cyber attack a new strain of virus a structural failure a violent storm a civil disturbance an
economic blow through an astonishing range of stories judith rodin shows how people organizations businesses communities and cities have
developed resilience in the face of otherwise catastrophic challenges medellin colombia was once the drug and murder capital of south america now it
s host to international conferences and an emerging vacation destination tulsa oklahoma cracked the code of rapid urban development in a floodplain
airbnb toyota ikea coca cola and other companies have realized the value of reducing vulnerabilities and potential threats to customers employees and

their bottom line in the mau forest of kenya bottom up solutions are critical for dealing with climate change environmental degradation and displacement of locals following superstorm sandy the rockaway surf club in new york played a vital role in distributing emergency supplies as we grow more adept at managing disruption and more skilled at resilience building rodin reveals how we are able to create and take advantage of new economic and social opportunities that offer us the capacity to recover after catastrophes and grow strong in times of relative calm

new york athens wenzhou boston oslo dhaka new orleans nairobi in recent years dozens of cities across the globe have been hit by large scale catastrophes of every kind natural disaster geopolitical conflict food shortages disease and contagion terrorist attacks if you haven't been directly touched by one of these cataclysms yourself in our interconnected world you are sure to have been affected in some way they harm vulnerable individuals destabilise communities and threaten organisations and even whole societies we are at greater risk than ever from city wide catastrophe and as the severity and frequency of these disasters increase we must become better at preparing for responding to and recovering from them be it haiti's dependence on humanitarian aid the rebuilding effort after the great fire of manhattan or the reason why more girls than boys drowned in japan's 2011 tsunami the resilience dividend combines vivid stories with practical insights such as how to disaster proof a building and ground breaking research to help build a radical future in which individuals companies and entire societies face disaster by creating more dynamic more resilient cities

this book explores the concept and practice of resilience that has generated much debate among both scholars and practitioners the contributions propose a new understanding of resilience both as a quality and a way of thinking taking it to the level of the person and the local to argue that a more sustainable way to govern the world today is bottom up and inside out while carrying a seemingly unifying message of self reliance adaptation and survival in the face of adversity resilience curiously continues to appear as all things to all people making it hard for the eu and international institutions to make full use of its arresting potential engendering resilience today in the highly volatile and uncertain world hit by crises pandemic and diminishing control becomes a priority as never before this book develops a more comprehensive view of resilience by looking at it both as a quality of the system and a way of thinking inherent to the local that cannot be engineered from the outside it is argued in this volume that in some cases the level of the person especially the person s sense of what constitutes a good life may be the most appropriate focus for understanding change and strategic adaptation in response to it this understanding widens the scope of discussion from what makes an entity system or person more adaptable to how one can best govern today to establish a stable equilibrium between the global and the local the external and the internal and become more responsive to the challenges and changes of today s highly uncertain world the chapters in this book were originally published in the journal contemporary security policy

this essential book offers suggestions for how cities and spaces can be planned and designed to reduce the impact of stress provide opportunities for recovery and promote the resilience of individuals in urban communities connecting research from different scientific disciplines the book provides a broader perspective of creating healthy lifestyle in society it focuses on mental health and well being by exploring how urban and workplace environments can be created to enhance and promote recovery divided into three parts the book begins by investigating the multi dimensional challenges of planning and design for stress reduction and recovery in urban areas part 2 concentrates on the design of residential and working environments including commuting between the two while part 3 considers how neighbourhoods and entire cities contribute to or obstruct stress reduction recovery and well being the book concludes by demonstrating how the insights from the book can be implemented in practice to create restorative and inclusive environments bringing together leading experts the book offers an interdisciplinary perspective for increasing well being in urban developments the book will be of interest to researchers and practitioners in related fields including environmental psychologists urban planners architects and landscape architects healthcare staff and policymakers

an examination of urban climate change response strategies and the resistance to them by grassroots activists and social movements cities around the world are formulating plans to respond to climate change and adapt to its impact often marginalized urban residents resist these plans offering counterplans to protest unjust and exclusionary actions in this book kian goh examines climate change response strategies in three cities new york jakarta and rotterdam and the mobilization of community groups to fight the perceived injustices and oversights of these plans looking through the

lenses of urban design and socioecological spatial politics goh reveals how contested visions of the future city are produced and gain power goh describes on the one hand a growing global network of urban environmental planning organizations intertwined with capitalist urban development and on the other social movements that themselves often harness the power of networks she explores such initiatives as rebuild by design in new york the giant sea wall plan in jakarta and rotterdam climate proof and discovers competing narratives including community resiliency in brooklyn and grassroots activism in the informal kampungs of jakarta drawing on participatory fieldwork and her own background in architecture and urban design goh offers both theoretical explanations and practical planning and design strategies she reframes the critical concerns of urban climate change responses presenting a sociospatial typology of urban adaptation and considering the notion of a just resilience finally she proposes a theoretical framework for designing equitable and just urban climate futures

this book challenges the concept of urban resilience by exploring its impact and limitations in three cities resilience has become a buzzword in science industry and policy and this volume offers a fresh perspective on urban resilience as a regulatory and constitutive principle of governance in cities cities constitute an extremely relevant playground for resilience as they are exposed to various disruptions from natural disasters and pandemics to political conflicts and terrorism this book traces the evolution of urban resilience from international development organizations to local governments and communities it explores how this concept was adopted and mobilized by different actors for different purposes and analyses the resulting resilience momentum in barcelona san francisco and santiago the book outlines the extent to which resilience has become a universal policy tool and a desired end state despite its clearly problematic definition it also contributes to the discussion about contemporary governance safety and security in times when their very nature and feasibility are being questioned this book will be of much interest to students of resilience studies urban studies development studies human geography and international relations

the frequency and severity of disasters over the last few decades have presented unprecedented challenges for communities across the united states in 2005 hurricane katrina exposed the complexity and breadth of a deadly combination of existing community stressors aging infrastructure and a powerful natural hazard in many ways the devastation of hurricane katrina was a turning point for understanding and managing disasters as well as related plan making and policy formulation it brought the phrase community resilience into the lexicon of disaster management building and measuring community resilience actions for communities and the gulf research program summarizes the existing portfolio of relevant or related resilience measurement efforts and notes gaps and challenges associated with them it describes how some communities build and measure resilience and offers four key actions that communities could take to build and measure their resilience in order to address gaps identified in current community resilience measurement efforts this report also provides recommendations to the gulf research program to build and measure resilience in the gulf of mexico region

this book presents and discusses methodological approaches and operational tools aimed at increasing the awareness and skills necessary to face the social economic and environmental challenges usually encountered in spatial planning in addition it deals with the concepts of risk and resilience from

both a theoretical and operational point of view the book promotes a better understanding of risk resilience and related notions such as vulnerability fragility and anti fragility in urban and landscape studies while also analyzing new planning policies accordingly it will benefit all researchers and public decision makers looking for an interdisciplinary approach to risk and resilience

contributions by urban planners sociologists anthropologists architects and landscape architects on the role and scope of urban design in creating more just and inclusive cities scholars who write about justice and the city rarely consider the practices and processes of urban design while discourses on urban design often neglect concerns about justice the editors of just urban design take the position that urban design interventions have direct and important implications for justice in the city the contributions in this volume contextualize the state of knowledge about urban design for justice stress inclusivity as the key to justice in the city affirm community participation and organizing as cornerstones of greater equity and assert that a just urban design must center and privilege our most marginalized individuals and communities approaching spatial and social justice in the city through the lens of urban design the contributors explore the possibility of envisioning and delivering social spatial and environmental justice in cities through urban design and the material reality of built environment interventions the editors combined expertise includes urban politics and climate change public space mobility justice community development housing and informality and the contributors include researchers and practitioners from urban planning sociology anthropology architecture and landscape architecture contributors rachel berney rebecca choi teddy cruz diane e davis fonna forman christopher giamarino kian goh alison b hirsch jeffrey hou anastasia loukaitou sideris setha low matthew jordan miller vinit mukhija chelina odert francesca piazzoni and michael rios

it is often said that it is lonely at the top but this loneliness can be dangerous not only to the leader but also to the led it turns out we hold our environments as we are held if we are not held in a caring and daring fashion it shows up in how we live and lead the basecamp manifesto is a formative work on developing and sustaining leadership skills here terence young outlines the development of a changed narrative around leading organizations rather than the often stereotyped perception of leadership as a solitary ascent to the top followed often by an equally solitary descent down the leadership peak young has created a framework for leadership that relies on developing a basecamp of companions like the familiar basecamps of extraordinary physical ascents of mount everest and other spectacular and spectacularly challenging peaks a leader s basecamp is a secure base of trusted and trusting peers that shape and nurture you during the ascent to leadership young presents the gifts that current and future leaders should find in a secure base greater clarity in the sense making process enhancement of agility in navigating dynamic situations building endurance to face challenges and fostering generativity for greater productivity and innovation in one s life quest the basecamp manifesto is written for leaders of all organizations whether for profit or nonprofit whether a business leader an educational leader a political leader a religious leader or other society facing leader all leaders face particular and specific challenges in leadership how do i lead and navigate with those in my circle through a world of increasing volatility uncertainty complexity and ambiguity for the sake of those you lead young s groundbreaking work says to leaders find your people find your secure base find and shape and nurture the circle of trust that can make you a quality leader the basecamp manifesto can help you to become intentional about shaping relationships where clarity agility durability and generativity can be found and fostered

how will climate change affect our lives where will its impacts be most deeply felt are we doing enough to protect ourselves from the coming chaos in extreme cities ashley dawson argues that cities are ground zero for climate change contributing the lion s share of carbon to the atmosphere while also lying on the frontlines of rising sea levels today the majority of the world s megacities are located in coastal zones yet few of them are adequately prepared for the floods that will increasingly menace their shores instead most continue to develop luxury waterfront condos for the elite and industrial facilities for corporations these not only intensify carbon emissions but also place coastal residents at greater risk when water levels rise in extreme cities dawson offers an alarming portrait of the future of our cities describing the efforts of staten island new york and shishmareff alaska residents to relocate holland s models for defending against the seas and the development of new york city before and after hurricane sandy our best hope lies not with fortified sea walls he argues rather it lies with urban movements already fighting to remake our cities in a more just and equitable way as much a harrowing study as a call to arms extreme cities is a necessary read for anyone concerned with the threat of global warming and of the cities of the world

u s emergency management in the 21st century from disaster to catastrophe explores a critical issue in american public policy are the current public sector emergency management systems sufficient to handle future disasters given the environmental and social changes underway in this timely book claire b rubin and susan l cutter focus on disaster recovery efforts community resilience and public policy issues of related to recent disasters and what they portend for the future beginning with the external societal forces influencing shifts in policy and practice the next six chapters provide in depth accounts of recent disasters the joplin tuscaloosa birmingham and moore tornadoes hurricanes sandy harvey irma maria and the california wildfires the book concludes with a chapter on loss accounting and a summary chapter on what has gone right what has gone wrong and why the federal government may no longer be a reliable partner in emergency management accessible and clearly written by authorities in a wide range of related fields with local experiences this book offers a rich array of case studies and describes their significance in shifting emergency management policy and practice in the united states during the past decade through a careful blending of contextual analysis and practical information this book is essential reading for students an interested public and professionals alike

as efforts to build emergency ready health systems intensify across the globe strategic investment for health system resilience a three layer framework provides a practical investment framework and a diverse set of country cases to inform decision making and strategic resource allocations the framework includes layer 1 risk reduction promoting emergency ready primary health care public health prevention and community preparedness layer 2 detection containment and mitigation capabilities and layer 3 advanced case management and surge response this three layer framework prioritizes interventions that prevent a public health threat from developing in the first place layer 1 limit its spread should one emerge layer 2 and manage a widespread crisis that compromises a health system s ability to deliver care sustainably layer 3 all three layers play a role in achieving health system resilience but not all of them have been leveraged equally in the past strategic investment for health system resilience offers a glimpse of the relatively low cost of investments in improving the operation of the weakest parts of the three layers layer 1 functions are estimated to cost between us 2 per capita in low income countries and us 4 per capita in lower middle income countries the framework applies equally to short term

epidemics of communicable diseases and to slow moving trends in noncommunicable diseases the pace of the needed response to health threats can vary but all require a system that is resilient across multiple layers of response although there is no universal blueprint for every setting it behooves all countries to seize the moment and invest in the three layers in ways that fit their needs

resilience has become an important topic on the safety research agenda and in organizational practice most empirical work on resilience has been descriptive identifying characteristics of work and organizing activity which allow organizations to cope with unexpected situations fewer studies have developed testable models and theories that can be used to support interventions aiming to increase resilience and improve safety in addition the absent integration of different system levels from individuals teams organizations regulatory bodies and policy level in theory and practice imply that mechanisms through which resilience is linked across complex systems are not yet well understood scientific efforts have been made to develop constructs and models that present relationships however these cannot be characterized as sufficient for theory building there is a need for taking a broader look at resilience practices as a foundation for developing a theoretical framework that can help improve safety in complex systems this book does not advocate for one definition or one field of research when talking about resilience it does not assume that the use of resilience concepts is necessarily positive for safety we encourage a broad approach seeking inspiration across different scientific and practical domains for the purpose of further developing resilience at a theoretical and an operational level of relevance for different high risk industries the aim of the book is twofold 1 to explore different approaches for operationalization of resilience across scientific disciplines and system levels 2 to create a theoretical foundation for a resilience framework across scientific disciplines and system levels by presenting chapters from leading international authors representing different research disciplines and practical fields we develop suggestions and inspiration for the research community and practitioners in high risk industries this book is open access under a cc by licence
