devastating natural disasters have profoundly shaped human history leaving us with a respect for the mighty power of the earth and a humbling view of our future paleontologist and geologist donald r prothero tells the harrowing human stories behind these catastrophic events prothero describes in gripping detail some of the most important natural disasters in history the new madrid missouri earthquakes of 1811 1812 that caused church bells to ring in boston the 2004 indian ocean tsunami that killed more than 230 000 people the massive volcanic eruptions of krakatau mount tambora mount vesuvius mount st helens and nevado del ruiz his clear and straightforward explanations of the forces that caused these disasters accompany gut wrenching accounts of terrifying human experiences and a staggering loss of human life floods that wash out whole regions earthquakes that level a single country hurricanes that destroy everything in their path all are here to remind us of how little control we have over the natural world dramatic photographs and eyewitness accounts recall the devastation wrought by these events and the people both heroes and fools that are caught up in the earth's relentless forces eerie fascinating and often moving these tales of geologic history and human fortitude and folly will stay with you long after you put the book down

those who survive major earthquakes often report the occurrence of mysterious phenomena beforehand unusual animal and plant behavior lightning strange clouds and malfunctioning electrical appliances in fact these stories are legendary the world over but are they merely legends are the many people who report them just superstitious or suffering from over active imaginations earthquakes and animals brings objective science to bear on these old legends but this is not the suspect science associated with recent attempts to validate ufo sightings the book places in front of the reader the simple laboratory evidence for the behaviour of animals plants and objects when they are subjected to intense electromagnetic pulses in many cases they behave in ways that have been recorded for centuries and are still reported today as earthquake related written for both the general public and scientists earthquakes and animals demonstrates experimentally a physical basis for the old earthquake legends it also adds tantalisingly to the science of earthquake prediction and cautiously suggests a legitimate new field of study electromagnetic seismology

disasters in world history surveys the development of disaster studies as a discipline as well as presenting historical case studies and theories used by historians to understand disasters disasters here defined as the complex interaction between natural hazards and specific human vulnerabilities have frequently left a mark on human history cataclysms have toppled dynasties fueled massacres and shaped the culture of societies frequently affected by natural hazards this volume fosters understanding of such events by considering both social science theory and the natural science concepts relevant to disaster studies in addition the text makes heavy use of an emerging psychological theory relevant to disaster studies the behavioral immune system which helps to explain why xenophobic behavior and even violence often erupt in the aftermath of disasters chapters consider specific examples of disasters earthquakes tsunamis volcanic eruptions climate change including modern anthropogenic climate change or global warming and tropical cyclones this book is an accessible resource ideal for undergraduates and instructors in world history environmental history and disaster studies courses

this book argues that although secular and religious perspectives on disasters have often conflicted today there are grounds for believing that the world's major faiths have much to contribute to the processes of post disaster recovery and future disaster risk reduction drr it seeks to demonstrate how contemporary dialogues between theologians disaster scholars and policymakers are defining new ways of working together these explore how the resources of religious communities e.g. buildings human resources and finance may be used to foster successful policies of drr particularly in the aftermath of earthquakes and volcanic eruptions musing on the relationships between religion and disasters has occurred for millennia and has affected many societies worldwide in societies where the world's major religions buddhism christianity hinduism islam judaism and shinto have been and remain dominant attempting to find supernatural explanations for disasters has occurred throughout history and there have been many theologies seeking to explain why people suffer losses it is argued that developments both within these traditions of faith and in how disasters are understood by the hazard research community of researchers and planners have allowed a new *modus vivendi* to emerge which emphasises both a recognition of religious worldviews by academic writers and disaster planners on the one hand and a desire by people of faith and their leaders to be more fully committed to the goals of drr the book will appeal to those who are interested in the interface between disasters and theology across the principal religions of the world this includes

researchers and students in geology geography theology and religious studies it will also be useful for specialist academic audience and the educated general reader
