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this book examines prevailing human health problems in political socioeconomic cultural and physical biotic settings of health practitioners and planners in ethiopia it also evaluates modern and traditional health resources and examines the occurrence of nonvectored communicable diseases

this ground breaking study offers new challenges to those teaching studying or developing strategies and policies in health and the environment bringing together a variety of approaches from different perspectives and different locations the contributors examine the various dimensions of health ecology in a human ecology framework examining how local regional and global factors impinge upon the health and environment of individuals communities and the globe

in this groundbreaking global analysis of the relationship between climate change and human health hans baer and merrill singer inventory and critically analyze the diversity of significant and sometimes devastating health implications of global warming using a range of theoretical tools from anthropology medicine and environmental sciences they present ecosyndemics as a new paradigm for understanding the relationship between environmental change and disease they also go beyond the traditional concept of disease to examine changes in subsistence and settlement patterns land use and lifeways throwing the sociopolitical and economic dimensions of climate change into stark relief revealing the systemic structures of inequality underlying global warming they also issue a call to action arguing that fundamental changes in the world system are essential to the mitigation of an array of emerging health crises link to anthropogenic climate and environmental change

individually and collectively resident microbes play important roles in host health and survival shaping and shaped by their host environments these microorganisms form intricate communities that are in a state of dynamic equilibrium this ecologic and dynamic view of host microbe interactions is rapidly redefining our view of health and disease it is now accepted that the vast majority of microbes are for the most part not intrinsically harmful but rather become established as persistent co adapted colonists in equilibrium with their environment providing useful goods and services to their hosts while deriving benefits from these host associations disruption of such alliances may have consequences for host health and investigations in a wide variety of organisms have begun to illuminate the complex and dynamic network of interaction across the spectrum of hosts microbes and environmental niches that influence the formation function and stability of host associated microbial communities microbial ecology in states of health and disease is the summary of a workshop convened by the institute of medicine s forum on microbial threats in march 2013 to explore the scientific and therapeutic implications of microbial ecology in states of health and disease participants explored host microbe interactions in humans animals and plants emerging insights into how microbes may influence the development and maintenance of states of health and disease the effects of environmental change s on the formation function and stability of microbial communities and research challenges and opportunities for this emerging field of inquiry

linking classical public health and intervention with evolving healthcare strategies and policies for the 21st century the new public health provides a broad perspective on current issues the kinds of solutions expectations needed in the future

drawing on ecosystem thinking complexity and postnormal science ecological health offers a radical new way of thinking about the health issues of the 21st century this volume reflects on recent social scientific engagement with ecosystem health research and practice and sets out a vision for the future

agroecology is the science of applying ecological concepts and principles to the design development and management of sustainable agricultural systems the ecology of agroecosystems highlights a collection of alternative agricultural methodologies and philosophies and provides an interdisciplinary approach that bridges the sociopolitical and historical context of agriculture it includes the technical issues in a serious and ecological fashion and captures the complex merging of ecology agriculture politics and economics in both a historical and contemporary context readers will learn not only about the ethical and moral elements related to producing food of questionable quality while possibly impairing the environment but also about the soil chemistry involved

written for researchers and practitioners in environmental pollution management and ecology this interdisciplinary account explores the ecological issues associated with industrial pollution to provide a complete picture of this important environmental problem from cause to effect to solution bringing together diverse viewpoints from academia and environmental agencies and regulators the contributors cover such topics as biological resources of mining areas biomonitoring of freshwater and marine ecosystems and risk assessment of contaminated land in order to explore important questions such as what are the effects of pollutants on functional ecology and ecosystems do current monitoring techniques accurately signal the extent of industrial pollution does existing policy provide a coherent and practicable approach case studies from throughout the world illustrate major themes and provide valuable insights into the positive and negative effects of industrial pollution the provision of appropriate monitoring schemes and the design of remediation and restoration strategies

case studies the book proposes the political ecology of austerity as an appropriate method of analysis that can inform our understanding of the shift in environmental protection policies and the intensification of growth practices green or otherwise that followed the 2008 global economic crisis the political ecology of austerity discloses austerity to be a globalised set of tools not only for budgetary discipline but also for socio environmental discipline that justifies the continuation of capital accumulation at the expense of further global environmental degradation this book will be of great interest to students and scholars of social and political sciences environmental studies urban studies and political ecology
