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the industrialization of food preservation and processing has been a dramatic development

across europe during modern times this book sets out its story from the beginning of the nineteenth century when preservation of food from one harvest to another was essential to prevent hunger and even famine population growth and urbanization depended upon a break out from the biological ancien regime in which hunger was an ever present threat the application of mass production techniques by the food industries was essential to the modernization of europe from the mid nineteenth century the development of food industries followed a marked regional pattern after an initial growth in north west europe the spread towards south east europe was slowed by social cultural and political constraints this was notable in the post second world war era the picture of change in this volume is presented by case studies of countries ranging from the united kingdom in the west to romania in the east all illustrate the role of food industries in creating new products that expanded the traditional cereal based diet of pre industrial europe industrially preserved and processed foods provided new flavours and appetizing novelties which led to brand names recognized by consumers everywhere product marketing and advertising became fundamental to modern food retailing so that europe s largest food producers danone nestlé and unilever are numbered amongst the world s biggest companies

this book focuses on how the political cultural and technical networks within the field of engineering provided the space within which an important professional middle class prospered in the city of são paulo and made lasting contributions to the development of modern brazil

war has been both an agent of destruction and a catalyst for innovation these two at first sight contradictory yet mutually constitutive outcomes of war waging are particularly pronounced in twentieth century asia while 1945 marked the beginning of peaceful recovery for europe military conflicts continued to play a critical role in the historical development of this part of the world in essence all wars in twentieth century asia stemmed from the political vacuum that developed after the fall of the japanese wartime empire intricately connecting one region with another yet they have had often very diverse consequences shattering the homes of some and bringing about affluence to others disarray of war may halt economic activities and render many aspects of life insignificant the need for food however cannot be ignored and the social action that it requires continues in all circumstances this book documents the effects of war on the lives of ordinary people through the investigation of a variety of connections that developed

between war waging and the production distribution preparation and consumption of food throughout asia since the 1930s the topics addressed range from issues at stake at the time of the conflicts such as provisioning the troops and food rationing and food relief for civilians to long term often surprising consequences of war waging and wartime mobilization of resources on the food systems diets and tastes of the societies involved the main argument of this volume is that war has not been a mere disruption but rather a central force in the social and cultural trajectories of twentieth century asia due to its close connection with human nourishment and comfort food stands central in the life of the individual on the other hand owing to its connection with profit and power food plays a critical role in the social and economic organization of a society what happens to food and eating is therefore an important index of change a privileged basis for the exploration of historical processes

olivia manning a woman at war is the first literary biography of the twentieth century novelist olivia manning it tells the story of a writer whose life and work were shaped by her own fierce ambition and like many of her generation the events and aftermath of the second world war from the time she left portsmouth for london in the mid 1930s determined to become a famous writer through her wartime years in the balkans and the middle east and until her death in london in 1980 olivia manning was a dedicated and hard working author married to a british council lecturer stationed in bucharest olivia manning arrived in romania on the 3rd september 1939 the fateful day when allied forces declared war on germany for the duration of world war two she kept one step ahead of invading german forces as she and her husband fled romania for greece and then greece for the middle east where they stayed until the end of the war these tumultuous wartime

years are the subject of her best known and most transparently autobiographical novels the balkan trilogy and the levant trilogy olivia manning refused to be labelled a feminist but her novels depict with cutting insight and sardonic wit the marginal position of women striving for independent identity in arenas frequently controlled by men whether on the frontlines of war or in the publishing world of the 1950s however she did not just write about world war two and women s lives amongst other things manning published fiction about making do in britain s post war age of austerity about desecration of the environment through uncontrolled development and about the painful adjustment to post war british life for young men as the author of thirteen published novels two volumes of short stories several works of non fiction and a regular reviewer of contemporary fiction she was a visible presence on the british literary scene throughout her life and her work provides a detailed insight into the period grounded in thorough research and enriched by discussion of previously unexamined manuscripts and letters olivia manning a woman at war is a timely study of olivia manning s remarkable life deirdre david integrates incisive critical analysis of manning s writing with extensive discussion of the historical contexts of her fiction

shakespeare has been a central figure in german literature and theatre this book tells the story of shakespeare in the german speaking theatre against the background of german culture and politics in the twentieth century it follows the earlier volume by simon williams on the reception of shakespeare during the previous 300 years shakespeare on the german stage 1586 1914 hortmann concentrates on the two most important and fruitful periods the years of the weimar republic 1919 1933 and the turbulent decades of the sixties and seventies when the german theatre was revitalised by a stormy marriage of avant garde art and revolutionary politics a section by maik hamburger covers developments in the theatres of the german democratic republic hortmann focuses on the most representative and colourful directors and actors describing and illustrating individual productions as examples of particular trends or movements

this work investigates the connection between intelligence history domestic policy military history and foreign relations in a time of increasing bureaucratization of the modern state the issues of globalization of foreign relations and the development of modern communication are also discussed

the social sciences rely more on the comparative method than on experimental data mainly because the latter is difficult to acquire amongst human populations the international social survey programme has played a pioneering role in creating and sustaining methodologically sophisticated mass attitude surveys across the globe starting in 1984 with five nations it now encompasses forty five nations spread over five continents each administering an identical annual survey to a random sample of their population analyses of the data or descriptions of the methodology already appear in over 3 000 publications this book contains new contributions from three dozen eminent scholars who analyse and compare the perceptions and attitudes of citizens across all five continents nations and over time subjects range from inequality and the role of the state ethnic national and global identities the changing relevance of religion beliefs and practices gender roles family values and work orientations household and society some chapters focus on methodological issues others focus on substantive findings this book sets new standards for cross cultural research
