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throughout world war ii audiences in the united kingdom craved entertainment even during the country's darkest days during this period actor manager donald wolfit and his theatre troupe toured great britain and europe often at great risk after the war wolfit broadened his tour bringing his brand of shakespearean theatre to north american audiences wolfit believed that theatre should be accessible to everyone regardless of their socioeconomic origins it was this quality above all that accounted for his huge popularity throughout the fifteen years of his operation in theatre of the people donald wolfit s shakespearean productions 1937 1953 laurence raw looks at this tenacious personality whose determination to serve the nation by performing shakespeare inspired audiences and fellow actors drawing on a series of hitherto unpublished materials including letters and interviews this part biography and part social history creates a vivid picture of what life was like for the touring actor during wwii and beyond recreating twelve of wolfit's touring dates throughout great britain and north america this volume also demonstrates theatre s importance as a source of mass entertainment and education as well as a propaganda tool despite wolfit s popular appeal at the time he was doomed to remain on the periphery of the theatrical establishment this book contends that wolfit deserves to be recognized for his efforts in maintaining public morale during times of stress theatre of the people will appeal not only to those interested in drama but also to students and scholars of history and popular entertainment in the 1940s and 1950s

theatre of the book explores the impact of printing on the european theater 1480 1880 far from being marginal to renaissance dramatists the printing press played as essential role in the birth of the modern theater looking at playtexts engravings actor portraits notation systems and theatrical ephemera as part of the broader history of theatrical ideas this illustrated book offers both a history of european dramatic publication and an examination of the european theater's continual refashioning of itself in the world of print

this exciting book uniquely combines interviews with scholars and practitioners in theatre studies to look at what most people feel is a pivotal moment of british theatre the 1990s with a particular focus on in yer face theatre this volume will be essential reading for all students and scholars of contemporary british theatre

in 1953 samuel beckett s waiting for godot premiered at a tiny avant garde theatre in paris within five years it had been translated into more than twenty languages and

seen by more than a million spectators its startling popularity marked the emergence of a new type of theatre whose proponents beckett ionesco genet pinter and others shattered dramatic conventions and paid scant attention to psychological realism while highlighting their characters inability to understand one another in 1961 martin esslin gave a name to the phenomenon in his groundbreaking study of these playwrights who dramatized the absurdity at the core of the human condition over four decades after its initial publication esslin s landmark book has lost none of its freshness the questions these dramatists raise about the struggle for meaning in a purposeless world are still as incisive and necessary today as they were when beckett s tramps first waited beneath a dying tree on a lonely country road for a mysterious benefactor who would never show authoritative engaging and eminently readable the theatre of the absurd is nothing short of a classic vital reading for anyone with an interest in the theatre

grzegorz niziolek s the polish theatre of the holocaust is a pioneering analysis of the impact and legacy of the holocaust on polish theatre and society from 1945 to the present it reveals the role of theatre as a crucial medium of collective memory and collective forgetting of the trauma of the holocaust carried out by the nazis on polish soil the period gave rise to two of the most radical and influential theatrical ideas during work on productions that addressed the subject of the holocaust grotowski s poor theatre and kantor s theatre of death but the author examines a deeper impact in the role that theatre played in the processes of collective disavowal to being a witness to others suffering in the first part the author examines six decades of polish theatre shaped by the perspective of the holocaust in which its presence is variously visible or displaced particular attention is paid to the various types of distortion and the effect of wrong seeing enacted in the theatre as well as the traces of affective reception shock heightened empathy indifference in part two niziolek examines a range of theatrical events including productions by leon schiller jerzy grotowski tadeusz kantor andrzej wajda krzysztof warlikowski and ondrej spišák he considers how these productions confronted the experience of bearing witness and were profoundly shaped by the legacy of the holocaust the polish theatre of the holocaust reveals how by testifying about society s experience of the holocaust theatre has been the setting for fundamental processes taking place within polish culture as it confronts suppressed traumatic wartime experiences and a collective identity shaped by the past

the first comprehensive guide to british theatre s engagement with the first world war over the last century providing accessible and lively coverage of theatre s role in the representation and remembrance of events focusing on topics including regionality politics popular performance shakespeare class race and gender

samuel beckett and the theatre of the witness explores beckett s representation of physical pain in his theatre plays in the long aftermath of world war ii emphasising how the issues raised by this staging of pain speak directly to matters lying at the heart of his work the affective power of the human body the doubtful capacity of language as a means of communication the aesthetic and ethical functioning of the theatre medium and the vexed question of intersubjective empathy alongside the wartime and post war plays of fellow francophone writers albert camus eugène ionesco pablo picasso and marguerite duras this study resituates beckett s early plays in a new conceptualising of le théâtre du témoin or a theatre of the witness these are plays concerned with the epistemological and ethical uncertainties of witnessing another s pain rather than with the sufferer s own direct experience they raise troubling questions about our capacity to comprehend and respond to another being s pain drawing on an interdisciplinary framework of extant criticism recorded historical audience response theatre and affect theory and medical understandings of bodily pain hannah simpson argues that these plays do not offer any easily negotiable encounter with physical suffering pushing us to recognise the very otherness of another being s pain even as it invades our own affective sphere in place of any comforting transcendence or redemption of endured pain they offer a starkly sceptical even pessimistic probing of what it is to witness another s suffering

theatres of independence is the first comprehensive study of drama theatre and urban performance in post independence india combining theatre history with theoretical analysis and literary interpretation aparna dharwadker examines the unprecedented conditions for writing and performance that the experience of new nationhood created in a dozen major indian languages and offers detailed discussions of the major plays playwrights directors dramatic genres and theories of drama that have made the contemporary indian stage a vital part of postcolonial and world theatre the first part of dharwadker's study deals with the new dramatic canon that emerged after 1950 and the variety of ways in which plays are written produced translated circulated and received in a multi lingual national culture the second part traces the formation of significant postcolonial dramatic genres from their origins in myth history folk narrative sociopolitical experience and the intertextual connections between indian european british and american drama the book s ten appendixes collect extensive documentation of the work of leading playwrights and directors as well as a record of the contemporary multilingual performance histories of major indian western and non western plays from all periods and genres treating drama and theatre as strategically

interrelated activities the study makes post independence indian theatre visible as a multifaceted critical subject to scholars of modern drama comparative theatre history and the new national and postcolonial literatures

theatre of the sphere is luis valdez s exploration of the principles that underlie his innovations as a playwright teacher and theatrical innovator he discusses the unique aesthetic more than five decades in the making that defines the work of his group el teatro campesino from shows staged on the backs of flatbed trucks by the participants in the delano grape strike of the 1960s to international megahits like zoot suit opening with a history of el teatro campesino rich with valdez s insights and remembrances the book s first part provides context for the development of the theatre of the sphere acting method the second part delivers the conceptual framework for valdez s acting theory and practice situating it in mayan mathematics and metaphysics the third part of the book applies this methodology to describe the viente pasos the 20 element exercise sequence that comprises the core practice of el teatro campesino strengthening the body balance precision and flexibility but also leadership collaboration observation vulnerability trust and expression of passion of consciousness of time place self community language and belief of honour faith morality and commitment the book concludes with the full text of valdez s poem el buen actor el mal actor and a comprehensive bibliography for further study this is a vital and indispensable text for today s actor as well as scholars and students of contemporary theatre american and chicano performance and the process of theatre making actor training and community performance

this book proposes a new way to consider theatre and performance that claims a special relationship to reality truth and authenticity it documents innovations in devising and staging theatre and performance that takes reality as its subject cultural shifts that have generated theatre of the real some of its problems and some possibilities

this new in paperback edition of world encyclopedia of contemporary theatre covers the americas from canada to argentina including the united states entries on twenty six countries are preceded by specialist introductions on theatre in post colonial latin america theatres of north america puppet theatre theatre for young audiences music theatre and dance theatre the essays follow the series format allowing for cross referring across subjects both within the volume and between volumes each country entry is written by specialists in the particular country and the volume has its own teams of regional editors overseen by the main editorial team based at the university of york in canada headed by don rubin each entry covers all aspects of theatre genres practitioners writers critics and styles with bibliographies over 200 black white

photographs and a substantial index this encyclopedia is indispensable for anyone interested in the cultures of the americas or in modern theatre it is also an invaluable reference tool for students and scholars of a wide range of disciplines including history performance studies anthropology and cultural studies

theatres of immanence deleuze and the ethics of performance is the first monograph to provide an in depth study of the implications of deleuze s philosophy for theatre and performance drawing from goat island butoh artaud and kaprow as well from deleuze bergson and laruelle the book conceives performance as a way of thinking immanence
