critics have suggested that Zora Neale Hurston's *Their Eyes Were Watching God* has helped revise a male dominated literary canon all new critical essays touch on subjects such as sight and vision speech and dialect and the ways the novel subverts traditional power structures and more

what does the tradition of marriage mean for people who have historically been deprived of its legal status generally thought of as a convention of the white middle class the marriage plot has received little attention from critics of African American literature in this study Ann Ducille uses texts such as Nella Larsen's *Quicksand* 1928 and Zora Neale Hurston's *Their Eyes Were Watching God* 1937 to demonstrate that the African American novel like its European and Anglo American counterparts has developed around the marriage plot what she calls the coupling convention exploring the relationship between racial ideology and literary and social conventions Ducille uses the coupling convention to trace the historical development of the African American women's novel she demonstrates the ways in which Black women appropriated this novelistic device as a means of expressing and reclaiming their own identity more than just a study of the marriage tradition in Black women's fiction however the coupling convention takes up and takes on many different meanings of tradition it challenges the notion of a single Black literary tradition or of a single Black feminist literary canon grounded in specifically Black female language and experience as it explores the ways in which white and Black male and female mainstream and marginalized traditions and canons have influenced and cross fertilized each other much more than a period study the coupling convention spans the period from 1853 to 1948 addressing the vital questions of gender subjectivity race and the canon that inform literary study today in this original work Ducille offers a new paradigm for reading Black women's fiction

modernism is typically thought of as focusing on the new and now not looking backward at historical catastrophes yet in many surprising often submerged ways the transatlantic slave trade shaped the works of both black and white writers this book reveals how modernists turned to the middle passage and in so doing upended western ideas about time and space race and gender and the category of the human bringing together afro diasporic and black studies scholarship modernist aesthetics and environmental studies laura winkiel presents a new literary history of modernism from the perspective of the atlantic and its role in slavery and colonization she examines the works of african caribbean british and us writers including joseph conrad william faulkner langston hughes zora neale hurston claude mckay jean rhys amos tutuola and virginia woolf as well as later interlocutors such as marlon james and jamaica kincaid paying particular attention to settings on shorelines deltas archipelagos and the ocean winkiel argues that allusions to the slave trade make visible the exploitative structural relations between the metropolis and the colonies and between the liberal subject and its others by turning to the ocean and its violent histories this groundbreaking book rethinks the fraught relationship of modernism and race

the literary tradition begun by zora neale hurston in the 1930s has since flourished and taken new directions with a diverse body of fiction by more contemporary african american women writers this book examines the treatment of domestic violence in hurston s their eyes were watching god gayl jones s corregidora gloria naylor s the women of brewster place and linden hills alice walker s the color purple toni morrison s the bluest eye and love terry mcmillan s mama and a day late and a dollar short and octavia butler s seed to harvest these novels have given voice to oppressed and abused women the aims of this work are threefold to examine how female african american novelists portray domestic abuse to outline how literary depictions of domestic violence are responsive to cultural and historical forces and to explore the literary tradition of novels that deal with domestic abuse within the african american community

gloria anzaldua book prize national women s studies association 2009 in the early twentieth century three women of color helped shape a new world of ethnographic discovery ella cara deloria a sioux woman from south dakota zora neale hurston an african american woman from florida and jovita gonzález a mexican american woman from the texas borderlands achieved renown in the fields of folklore studies anthropology and ethnolinguistics during the 1920s and 1930s while all three collaborated with leading male intellectuals in these disciplines to produce innovative ethnographic

accounts of their own communities they also turned away from ethnographic meaning making at key points in their careers and explored the realm of storytelling through vivid mixed genre novels centered on the lives of women in this book coteria offers an intellectual history situated in the borderlands between conventional accounts of anthropology women's history and african american mexican american and native american intellectual genealogies at its core is also a meditation on what it means to draw three women from disparate though nevertheless interconnected histories of marginalization into conversation with one another can such a conversation reveal a shared history that has been erased due to institutional racism sexism and simple neglect is there a mode of comparative reading that can explore their points of connection even as it remains attentive to their differences these are the questions at the core of this book which offers not only a corrective history centered on the lives of women of color intellectuals but also a methodology for comparative analysis shaped by their visions of the world

zora neale hurston 1891 1960 the most prominent of the harlem renaissance women writers was unique because her social and professional connections were not limited to literature but encompassed theatre dance film anthropology folklore music politics high society academia and artistic bohemia hurston published four novels three books of nonfiction and dozens of short stories plays and essays in addition she won a long list of fellowships and prizes including a guggenheim and a rosenwald yet by the 1950s hurston like most of her harlem renaissance peers had faded into oblivion an essay by alice walker in the 1970s however spurred the revival of hurston's literary reputation and her works including her 1937 novel *Their Eyes Were Watching God* have enjoyed an enduring popularity zora neale hurston an annotated bibliography of works and criticism consists of reviews of critical interpretations of hurston's work in addition to publication information each selection is carefully crafted to capture the author's thesis in a short pithy analytical framework also included are original essays by eminent hurston scholars that contextualize the bibliographic entries meticulously researched but accessible these essays focus on gaps in hurston criticism and outline new directions for hurston scholarship in the twenty first century comprehensive and up to date this volume contains analytical summaries of the most important critical writings on zora neale hurston from the 1970s to the present in addition entries from difficult to locate sources such as small academic presses or international journals can be found here although intended as a bibliographic resource for graduate and undergraduate students this volume is also aimed toward general readers interested in women's literature african american literature american history and popular culture the book will also appeal to scholars and teachers studying twentieth century american literature as well as those specializing in anthropology modernism and african american studies with a special focus on the women of the harlem renaissance

how fictional representations of dead bodies develop over the twentieth century is the central concern of lisa k perdigao's study of american writers arguing that the crisis of bodily representation can

be traced in the move from modernist entombment to postmodernist exhumation perdigao considers how works by writers from f scott fitzgerald william faulkner willa cather and richard wright to jody shields toni morrison octavia butler and jeffrey eugenides reflect changing attitudes about dying death and mourning for example while modernist writers direct their plots toward a transformation of the dead body by way of metaphor postmodernist writers exhume the transformed body reasserting its materiality rather than viewing these tropes in oppositional terms perdigao examines the implications for narrative of the authors apparently contradictory attempts to recover meaning at the site of loss she argues that entombment and exhumation are complementary drives that speak to the tension between the desire to bury the dead and the need to remember indicating shifts in critical discussions about the body and about the function of aesthetics in relation to materialized violence and loss

we speak a different tongue maverick voices and modernity 1890 1939 challenges the critical practice of privileging modernism in so doing the volume makes a significant contribution to contemporary debates about re visioning literary modernism questioning its canon and challenging its aesthetic parameters by utilizing the term modernity rather than modernism the 16 essays housed in this volume foreground the writers who have been marginalised by both their contemporary modernist writers and literary scholars while exploring the way in which these authors responded to the tensions
