with over eleven hundred performances in the united states and england between 1902 and 1905 in dahomey became a landmark of american musical theater created and performed entirely by african americans it showcased the talent of conservatory trained composer will marion cook and the popular vaudevillians bert williams and george walker this edition presents the musical and textual materials of in dahomey in a comprehensive piano vocal score with many musical numbers that were added or substituted in various early productions this complete array of songs makes this the first publication of its type

as the composer lyricist for godspell pippin wicked and other musicals stephen schwartz has enjoyed one of the mostsignificant careers in american musical theater for more than four decades schwartz has also achieved success on the big screen contributing to such films as enchanted the prince of egypt and pocahontas for his work he has received six tony nominations three grammys and three academy awards the musical theater of stephen schwartz from godspell to wicked and beyond is a detailed examination of schwartz s various projects throughout his career musicologist paul r laird discusses at length schwartz s major shows and also considers his other ventures such as the music and lyrics for animated features from disney and dreamworks the book focuses on two major aspects of schwartz s creations the process of collaboration resulting in a project s completion and a descriptive analysis of his music and lyrics laird also describes each show s critical reception and its place in the larger history of musical theater based on extensive interviews with schwartz and a number of his major collaborators this book provides a rare look into the creation of the composer and lyricist s shows and films the musical theater of stephen schwartz is intended for fans as well as students and professional researchers in music theater and the musical theater

the national library of greece ethnike bibliothike tes ellados is one of the richest depositories of byzantine musical manuscripts and is surpassed by its holdings in greece only by the multitude of manuscripts found in the monasteries of mount athos in spite of being such a rich archive the national library has never published a catalogue of its musical manuscripts not all of which are byzantine or greek it is the purpose of this catalogue to recover or in some instances to present for the first time the repertory

of the musical sources of the library this project has been twelve years in the making for professor diane touliatos involving the discovery and detailed cataloguing of all 241 western ancient greek and byzantine music manuscripts not all of these are from athens or modern greece but also encompass turkey the balkans italy cyprus and parts of western europe this variety underlines the importance of the catalogue for identifying composers music and performance practice of different locales the catalogue includes a detailed listing of the contents as written in the original language as well as the titles of compositions and or incipits with composers modal signatures other attributions and information on performance practice each manuscript entry includes a commentary in english indicating important highlights and its significance there is a substantive english checklist that summarizes the contents of each manuscript for non greek readers a bibliography follows containing pertinent citations where the manuscript has been used in references there is also a glossary that defines terms for the non specialist examples of some of the manuscripts will be photographically displayed the catalogue will enlighten musicologists and byzantinists of the rich and varied holdings of some of the most important musical manuscripts in existence and stimulate more interest and investigation of these sources as such it will fill a major ga

one type of analysis cannot fit every play nor does one method of interpretation suit every theatre artist or collaborative team this is the first text to combine traditional and non traditional models giving students a range of tools with which to approach different kinds of performance
